

ATG buys Broadway theatre

Ambassador Theatre Group (ATG), which owns the New Alexandra Theatre in Birmingham, as well as the Regent Theatre and Victoria Hall in Stoke-on-Trent, has announced that it's acquired the largest theatre on Broadway. Situated in a prime position on New York's 42nd Street, The Foxwoods Theatre is currently home to the most talked-about show on Broadway -Spider-Man: Turn Off The Dark. This latest purchase brings the number of theatres in ATG's portfolio to forty.

Fierce Festival announces return of Franko B

One of the most provocative performers ever to appear at Fierce Festival is to make a welcome return to the event this year. Franko B will join forces with a dancing animatronic polar bear to present a large-scale theatrical performance, combining dance and film, at Warwick Arts Centre in Coventry. Other Fierce highlights include French artist Denis Tricot creating a giant Birmingham City Centre sculpture from strips of wood, and culinary fun with Blanch and Shock, who'll be creating a feast using produce grown in Edible Eastside. Fierce runs at various locations around Birmingham from 4 to 6 October, with full programming details due



to be announced in August.

Grand Union gets a £100,000 birthday present

Birmingham's Eastside gallery and artists' studio Grand Union has been awarded a grant of £100,000 by Arts Council England.

The funds will enable the artist-run space in Digbeth, which is celebrating its third birthday, to increase its programming and bring more international artists to the city. A Small Hiccup,

a group presentation featuring eight new commissions that include performance, video, sculpture and digital media, will continue to show at the venue until Saturday 29 June.





Midlands' youngsters to take to the stage

An eclectic programme of plays, including Carlo Goldoni's A Servant Of Two Masters, Shakespeare's Twelfth Night and Mark Ravenhill's Totally, lies at the heart of a July festival for budding performers. Inspired by Birmingham Rep's centenary and its exploration of both new and classic literature. The Young Rep Summer Festival of Theatre takes place at Birmingham's Old Rep venue. The two-week-long mini-festival will see more than two hundred young people from across Birmingham and the West Midlands (aged between nine and twenty-five) come together to perform. A highlight of the festival will be the world premiere of Evan Placey's Girls Like That, a play written especially for young people which explores 'the perilous consequences that can happen when teenagers and technology join forces'. The Young REP Summer Festival of Theatre plays at Birmingham's Old Rep from 1 to 13 July.

More folk for Shrewsbury

In addition to hosting a highly regarded annual folk festival every August, the Shropshire market town of Shrewsbury is also earning itself a mighty fine reputation for attracting guality folk performers throughout the year. American singer-songwriter Richard Shindell, Cara Luft, Katriona Gilmore, Jamie Roberts and Belshazzar's Feast have all been booked to appear at the town's Hive venue between August and December. Shakespeare's bloodiest play gives chef food for thought

A new production of Shakespeare's rarely performed and bloodiest play Titus Andronicus has stirred the creativity of two Royal Shakespeare Company employees. In a lighthearted nod to the cooking that goes on in the play's final act, RSC chef Nick Funnell has created the Titus Pie - a puff pastry crust filled with steak and kidney, vegetables and herbs. Meanwhile, showing off her mixologist skills, Bar Manager Alice Cook has concocted The Bloody Tamora, which, named after the play's Queen of the Goths character, relates to some of Titus'

bloodthirsty scenes. The Titus Pie will feature on the menu in the RST Rooftop Restaurant for the duration of Titus Andronicus's Stratford run (until 26 October). Alice's cocktail will be available from the theatre bar.

REP initiative receives financial boost

The Birmingham Repertory Theatre's Rep Foundry artist development programme has received a significant boost to its funds. An Arts Scholarship in excess of £136,000 over a three-year period has been awarded by the Leverhulme Trust, and will enable the programme to continue until 2016. Created earlier this year under the guidance of the theatre's Artistic Director Roxana Silbert, the Rep Foundry aims to discover and promote the West Midlands' most promising burgeoning talent, with a group of eighteen writers, directors and theatre-makers receiving mentoring and professional support from staff at The Rep and leading theatre practi-

tioners. As well as master classes with theatre professionals, Rep Foundry artists have the opportunity to present work in progress in front of an audience at monthly scratch performance nights.

Bruce Joel Rubin

The creator of Ghost, in conversation...

When Bruce Joel Rubin's Ghost first hit cinema screens in July 1990, the romantic fantasy about the power of love became an overnight box office success, winning an Oscar for Best Original Screenplay. After years of deliberation, Bruce finally gave the go-ahead for the movie to be adapted into a stage musical, a touring version of which arrives in the region this month...

So Bruce, what provided the initial inspiration for the movie Ghost?

I guess I was a creature of the '60s, and the psychedelic revolution made me very aware of life, death and, I guess, different terms. So I started to explore this idea that we exist before we are born and that we exist even after we're dead. I believe there's a continuum at play. I wanted to explore that, and talk about it in a mass-audience arena. I don't know why, but I was given the opportunity to do that. Somewhere along the way I wanted to do a movie about a ghost, told from the side of the ghost. I thought it would be an important story, but I didn't have a way in. I didn't know how to tell that story. Then, by chance, I was watching a production of Hamlet, and in the second scene the ghost of his father appears on the parapet and says 'avenge my death'. I knew at that moment that that was the access point, and that I wanted to tell that story in twentieth century New York. It moved forward from that.

Was it a difficult storyline to sell?

Nothing's immediate. I pitched the idea for about two years around Hollywood. What happened - which was a really wonderful gift - was that people's eyes would glaze over. So I'd keep changing the story to make it more interesting, and it kept getting better and better. Finally, in about the last week of pitching, I went to five different places. Everyone I pitched to during that last week wanted it, but it had taken two years.

And the rest, as they say, is history. So when did the idea to adapt it for the stage first come about?

People have talked to me about it over the years, and I kept saying no, I had no interest. I really had a fear, actually, that they'd be singing these little tinkly songs which, for me, is the case with many

musicals, and I just didn't want that. Then the producers for the show invited themselves to upstate New York where I lived and tried to sell it to me. They came to my house and we talked and talked, so much so that they missed their trains to New York City and ended up staying over at my house. During that very long night, I began to see that these songs really could begin to take the emotions in the material and deepen them, and give the characters a chance to sing about how they feel, and about much that was left unspoken in the movie. And that began to get me excited. So I committed to it and I said, 'let's just try it and see where it goes'. We attracted amazing talent, people like Dave Stewart and Glen Dower, to do the music and insert lyrics, and Matthew Warchus and Tom Powell. We have such amazing people on this show. It just continued to come together and get better and better. All I wanted at that point was to bask in it and be part of it. I mean, how many times do you get the chance to be part of a musical?

So have you worked hand-in-hand with Matthew since those very early stages?

Very much so. Even today, we're all here working on the tour. This is a tour of a West End production and it really is quite astounding. I'm amazed as to what we've been able to achieve. We've had to cut back on some levels to bring the show to certain theatres, but I don't think people will even notice that. They'll just be blown away.

It's certainly very ambitious. Were you ever concerned that it wasn't achievable to the level that you wanted?

Of course - everyone fears that. When you're working on any kind of production there's very often a fear that it won't rise to the occasion. I don't have that fear with Ghost. I think there's a certain truth to the movie, and I love what's happening on stage. I love watching the show grow, and the actors finding their way into the characters, and watching it emerge as a great piece of work. It's an organic process, and the result is that the play delivers - it's touching people in so many ways.

Sam and Molly were iconic roles for Patrick Swayze and Demi Moore. Was it ever difficult to envisage anyone else in those roles?

Yeah, a little bit. That is, until I saw Richard and Casey, who appeared in the West End and who were in Manchester where it started. Straight away they stole my heart. I knew then that this could be anybody, and that people can move into those parts relatively easily. The hardest role, in a way, is that of Oda Mae Brown. I'm amazed we've found such amazing people to take on that character, because Whoopi is truly iconic. For people to take it on and make it their own is really hard. We've had great people, and now we have a new Oda Mae in Wendy Mae Brown, and she really is quite extraordinary.

How spooky is that! A Wendy Mae Brown playing Oda Mae Brown...

Yeah, that's quite extraordinary. I think she was probably born to play the role.

Having seen the show, I found all the principal characters were spot on, but Wendy Mae certainly has something that's very special...

I agree. I was thrilled to discover her when I sat down to watch this new production for the first time. I'd seen casting tapes but you don't know until you see people on stage how real they are and how good they are. In the movie, too, the Whoopi character kind of saves the show. The whole show couldn't just be about two people who are pining for each other. I knew we needed to level it with some kind of honest humour, and having a fake psychic having to deal with this terrifying situation of actually meeting a dead man was such a merciful idea. It saves the movie and it saves the show and brings a different level.

The West End show was a great success, but the touring version is said to be more like the Broadway version. Why?

Mostly because Matthew had a sense of things he wanted to change. There's one moment in the movie where Sam meets a ghost, who tells him a little bit about what it means to be a ghost. It's at a point where Sam's still fighting with the idea that he's even dead. We created a version of that guy for the London show which was a kind of tap-dancing guy, and a lot of people couldn't make the switch easily enough to go suddenly into 'I'm dead, and there's a tapdancing guy telling me about what death is'. So we thought we'd go for more of a New Orleans style, because they do have a kind of funeral-style singing which is quite powerful. We tried it to see how it worked and we loved it. And here we've tried something more interesting. We've taken the character out altogether as a single person and we've made him other ghosts. We divided the part up, and that, to me, is the most successful version of all. It's very effective.

It's a very full-on production, with some amazing illusions. Were you concerned that it might be a bit excessive in parts? Matthew and the whole creative team have been in New York working on Matilda, so it's only been the last couple of days that we've seen the production come together. We've all made our notes on how to calm it down a little, so to speak.

The special effects are simply amazing, and it must have been quite difficult to bring some of the illusions from the movie to the stage. Did you have a firm idea about what you wanted to have happen? Well, we knew he had to walk through a door. That was one thing that had to happen. We also knew that we had to create a moment where he convinces Molly that he's there with her. We went from the penny on the door, which was just too small to register with those at the back of an auditorium, to the folding of a letter by itself in her hand.

The spirits rising from the body is also a spectacular sight...

Yeah, just the idea that these guys die and within seconds of them being dead you see their body on the stage at the same time as they're rising above the stage! The pottery scene is probably the most famous part of the film, but the stage show doesn't major on that very much. Is there a reason why it was played down? In a sense we wanted to give it a certain emotionality - for the pottery wheel to be there after Sam died, rather than before. We felt that to play it upfront slowed down the progression of the show. Having him being there with a pottery wheel, trying to hold her when he couldn't, was quite powerful. For me, it was an interesting choice, but I can see that some people would want to see it as it was in the film. But it's still there.

Do you have a favourite scene in the stage show?

Probably not. I'm amazed by so many of the things that happen. The subway scene is quite extraordinary; the Oda Mae scene is so vibrant and so funny. I always think the last scene, where Sam says 'the love's inside you, take it with you', really delivers. The audience always gets very emotional, and I get very gratified by that.

So why do you think Ghost remains so successful?

It addresses probably the central desire of human beings for fulfillment. One, that life goes on, which is something that I truly believe personally, and two, that you could possibly have one more moment with someone you love. The latter is something which probably drives more people's fantasy lives than anything. There's this story about a man who was in a plane that crashed into the Hudson River a couple of years ago. When he was rescued, he was standing on the wing, and later told the New York Times that all he could think about when he was getting off the plane was the movie Ghost. He said, "I wondered if, in fact, I was like Patrick Swayze, and my body was on the plane and I was there as a spirit on the wing'. I remember thinking to myself when I read that, 'Oh my God, if the first thing that someone thinks about when they're involved in something like that is your movie, then you've made some sort of an impact'.

Out of all the work you've created because, as we know, this isn't your only success - would you say Ghost is your greatest achievement?

I've loved working on it more than anything, and Ghost has served me very well. But there's a very underrated film that I did called Jacob's Ladder, which I think may be more important in terms of capturing some of what it is that I want to say. I really love Jacob's Ladder. I love all of the work that I've created, but Ghost has definitely been the most joyful ride that I've had.

So would you ever look at adapting any of your other creations for the stage? Oh, no, no, no. I've gotten old. I've had my

one musical. I'm grateful for the chance to be involved all the way, though. I'll leave the others to someone else.

Sean Foley brings Jacobean comedy to the RSC

Sean Foley

Actor, writer and director Sean Foley has created numerous original comedies, including the Olivier Award-winning The Play What I Wrote. His credits as a director include the stage version of The Ladykillers. Sean's currently working on numerous projects, including Harry Hill's X Factor The Musical and an imminent RSC production of Thomas Middleton's A Mad World My Masters. Sean recently took time out of his busy schedule to talk about his career, and to explain what audiences can expect from his re-working of this relatively unknown Jacobean comedy.

You're currently directing A Mad World My Masters. How did your involvement with this RSC production come about?

The RSC approached me and said, "You're a likely sort of cove to direct a comedy, so what do you want to do?". I said, "Well, I'm not going to do a Shakespeare comedy". Not because I don't think they're brilliant but because there are already plenty of great versions of Comedy Of Errors and A Midsummer Night's Dream. I thought it might be fun to take a look at one of Shakespeare's contemporaries and see if there was something there that took my fancy. So I ended up looking at various plays, and this one seemed to me to be an undiscovered masterpiece. To his credit, when I told Michael Boyd that I'd like to do a piece by Thomas Middleton, he said: "Absolutely fantastic. You must do it!".

What lay behind the decision to transpose the story to 1950s Soho?

Well, it's a London play. It's full of prostitutes, scoundrels and scamsters. That kind of postwar Soho world - before everything changed in the '60s - seemed like a really good transposition of the Jacobean world. The same things have happened throughout human history, but I've always thought the look was fantastic in the 1950s. The show is based very much around women and what's expected of them; that need to be conformist. Men's fear of women, and everything about the play, made me feel that you could set it in the 1950s and it would be just the same as it was in 1608, when it was written.

Would it have easily fitted into the '60s?

No, in the '60s we've got the feeling of what we used to call Women's Lib, but in the '50s that's all still brewing up. The play has some wonderfully strong female characters who're determined to shape their own lives but who face - I guess what women still face - a society that won't let them. One of the huge things in the play is sex, and it's worth pointing out that this is the filthiest play - in its original form - that I've ever seen. I kept looking back at the notes, thinking, "he can't possibly mean that. That's another pun on the word penis!". Let me put it this way. If it wasn't so funny, it would be shocking.

You made reference to the play being based around strong female characters. Would the piece be better in the hands of a female director?

We've got brilliant actresses in the company and a great female designer. The strength of the women characters was one of the reasons I wanted to do the play, and - I'll probably get shot for saying this - I think there are greater roles for women in this than there are in Shakespeare's plays, with the exception of Rosalind in As You Like It. The play has two major themes - sex and money - and it's brilliantly satirical. It's got a wonderful mix of classic goodness and comic genres. There's a lot of slapstick, plenty of character comedy, and it's very naughty. It's cynical in one sense but it's also very festive and celebratory.

You're making use of 1950s music. Will there be recognisable numbers? Some will be quite well known, others not so.

How is the music used in the show? Each of the main characters has a theme tune, as it were. We've got a live band, and there are six or seven numbers. The show starts as if the audience is in a cafe/nightclub in Soho in 1958, where there's a brilliant jazz/blues singer called Linda Jon Pier. There's music accompanying the action throughout, and occasionally we break into actual song.

Do you see the production appealing to a wide audience?

Definitely. If this was written now, I wouldn't say that people would be outraged, but it's full of the sort of stuff that you're not supposed to laugh at but everyone does.

So you can hide behind that ...

That's the brilliance of Middleton's writing. It's so full of innuendo that you could never actually say 'hang on a minute, he's talking about a woman's parts, isn't he?'. Thomas Middleton would say, "No, she's just saying that she wants to visit the man next door". It's full of brilliantly written innuendo. It's a bit like Max Miller coming on stage and saying, "I've got all sorts of material. Where do you want it from, the blue book or the red book?". Basically, everyone, if they're honest, would say they wanted it from the blue book. So it's full of that, but it's not the only thing in the play. It also tells this great story about these wonderful characters who strive to find love and fortune in 1950s London.

A Mad World My Master marks your RSC debut. What does it mean to you to be performing at the home of the Bard?

For me, it was completely unexpected. I've written and performed in a lot of my own work. I had my own theatre company, so I wrote and was part of creating original comic theatre shows which ended up in the West End. It's only more recently I've started directing. So it's a surprising delight to be invited to work with this world-famous theatre company. I was surprised when they asked me, and was equally surprised when they said yes to me doing A Mad World My Master. Also, as I've been working on the play, I'm surprised as to how great it is as a comedy. It's just full of the most brilliant comic situations, and points out just how hypocritical many of us are, but does so in the most delicious way.

You've touched on moving from acting to directing. Did you see this as a natural progression?

In my own company, I did writing within the shows, and, inevitably, because we ran the company, I was also one of the artistic directors. So I was actually making loads and loads of decisions by comparison with what a more traditional theatre director would do. So it wasn't a huge leap to decide to direct. I wouldn't say it was inevitable, but it was an easier step than it would have been if I'd just been an actor-for-hire.

What do you consider to have been the bravest thing you've ever done professionally?

Probably going on stage in Calcutta with a self-written show in front of about ninety Indian nuns. I was on tour with my own show, a comedy about a double-act entitled Stop Calling Me Vernon.

How did the show go down with the nuns? It was brilliant, they loved it. There was a blackout for about ten minutes where we had to improvise, but it worked out okay. We also took the show to a town in Northern Syria which is currently being bombed to hell, called Illepo, and all of our props went missing. We had to run around the whole town trying to gather props for the evening performance. That was pretty scary as well. Those are the brave moments. My first official directing gig was an evening of Harold Pinter's comic sketches, of which he wrote a lot, and I suppose I was a little bit nervous the night he came to see it. But thankfully he loved it.

So what would be your proudest moment? What Harold Pinter said to me after the show...

Which was?

Well, let's just say it was my proudest moment... that, and the opening night of The Play What I Wrote.

And what about The Ladykillers?

Yeah, that was another proud moment. That makes it three! I suppose getting an Olivier Award nomination for Best Director was a proud moment because it was the first play I'd directed in the West End. I was very proud of that show, and one of the things that I'd like to communicate is that lots of people in the business told me that they'd go to see it; they'd got their friends, they'd got their families and people who don't normally go to the theatre to go along and see it also. These were people who don't normally go to the theatre because they don't think it's entertaining enough. Almost universally it came back that they'd loved it. I think, if anything, that's what I'm about - trying to create theatre that will be liked by people who don't like theatre. You can have an incredibly entertaining evening, but it doesn't mean it's not intelligent. It doesn't mean it doesn't have a plot or a story - all of the shades that are necessary in a piece of theatre. But first of all it has to be a good night out for people, and I'm sure that's what we're creating here with Middleton's comedy.

Did the success of The Ladykillers surpass your expectations?

You never know something's going to be a massive hit. I've made shows which are equally as good, but they've never become massive hits, and you never know why. Some things audiences take to, and it's the audience that makes it a hit. It can be a good show but they make it a hit. The only thing you're in control of is putting on a good show and giving people a good time.

Which playwright do you most admire? Samuel Beckett. I think he's much, much funnier than most people give him credit for. I also really like Shakespeare and Bertholt Brecht.

Is there a particular up-and-coming playwright you'd like to 'big up'? There's a guy who I've been working with on this adaptation named Phil Torter. He's a young guy who's recently been commissioned by the RSC to write something. I'm going to say him, because he

was great to work with and he's done a really great job with me on A Mad World My Master.

You're directing Harry Hill's parody of The X Factor. Where are you with that at the moment?

Well, it's been confirmed that we're going to do it and that it's going to be early next year. We've done quite a lot of work on it already lots of workshops and writing, and we've got all the songs - so I guess it's quite advanced, really. We had a big showing when Simon Cowell came along, and he loved it.

Does Simon have any input into the musical?

He's actually been brilliant, and sort of clever, inasmuch as he saw that it was a great idea and let us get on with it. He's very occasionally come along and offered a few little thoughts; generally, though, he's been very hands-off but supportive.

Any hints on casting yet?

That's all under wraps at the moment. I'll tell you when I know...

You're also going to be directing a new adaptation of PG Wodehouse's Jeeves And Wooster, entitled Perfect Nonsense... Yeah. Funnily enough, we're planning to make some announcements on that one very soon. We'll workshop it initially and then we're hoping to get it into the West End.

You're juggling quite a lot of projects at the moment. Is it sometimes difficult to stay focused when there's so much going on?

Actually, I think it helps. I quite like it this way.

So is it normal for you to have so many different projects on the go at any one time?

Well, there are quite a few at the moment, I have to admit. I've actually been working X Factor The Musical since last April, so that's just over a year already, and we don't go into rehearsal until January next year. In the meantime, you're working with the writers and the designers. So you're not full-time on anything. It's a bit like cooking - things come to the boil at different times. Let's just say I've got a few things on the stove and I'm hoping that I'm going to manage to get them to the table at various points in time.

Was a career in theatre something to which you'd always aspired?

I'm always astounded that I'm, one, employed, and two, employable! But 'no' is the answer to that. It wasn't until I was in my twenties that I started to make a go of it, albeit in a curious way. I invented a company with a couple of other people and we started making our own shows. It wasn't like I was going to be an actor on the RSC stage. It wasn't like I wanted to play Hamlet - and I guess no one's going to ask me to now either! It wasn't that kind of ambition. It was more about creating work, creating theatre shows to make people laugh, which is essentially what I'm still doing now.

A Mad World My Master shows at **The Swan Theatre, Stratford-upon-Avon,** from Thurs 6 June to Fri 25 October. I know this probably sounds a bit of a cliche, but we just do what makes us laugh. I think that's the most honest thing you can do.

Peter Lord

talks about the world of animation...

As co-founder of Aardman Animations, Peter Lord is responsible for some of the best clay animations ever to grace TV and cinema screens. His popular creation Morph made his debut on Take Hart in 1977 and was an instant success. Since then, Aardman has garnered worldwide praise thanks to such undertakings as Wallace And Gromit, Chicken Run, Shaun The Sheep and Pirates! In An Adventure With Scientists, the latter of which has inspired a touring exhibition that's currently showing at Birmingham's Thinktank. What's On recently caught up with Peter to find out more about the world of animation.

What was behind the decision to take The Pirates! In An Adventure With Scientists out on tour as an exhibition?

We've always really wanted to do exhibitions. It was always very high on our list with Pirates, because the whole thing looks so lovely. We know that people love looking at the stuff that we do - the models and props are so beautiful. We love doing exhibitions and we're always looking for opportunities, but you do need a good partner because it's quite expensive. Even though we have all the sets ready-made, they're big and quite cumbersome to get about.

It's not just the visual side of things, there are also a good many hands-on activities associated with the exhibition. Do you offer advice to venues on how they should proceed on that level?

It's all very collaborative, and I've been quite involved over the months, making sure that it's what we wanted it to be. We depend on advice from the people who put on the exhibitions, because it's a special art form and quite different from film making. But then again, we've done quite a lot ourselves over the years. Part of the exhibition is so that the kids can get some hands-on experience, which is fun while they're at the exhibition and hopefully inspires them to go away and do their own thing with animation.

And creating your own movies at home is far more viable nowadays...

Yes, it's hilarious, really. It's so much easier now than when I started out a very long time ago. Then it was a highly esoteric activity for a few enthusiasts. Nowadays, everyone can do it. All you need is access to a computer. It's partly technology and partly psychological, inasmuch as people think that they can do it, which is great, because they can do it. As schoolboys, we didn't know anybody else of our age who was creating animation. We just appeared to be doing some weird, freakish thing that was seen as highly specialist.

Were you seen as a geek?

No, I think people then, as they are now, were quite impressed. They were amazed by it, and the fact that it could be done. Our films were first shown on TV when we were about seventeen, which I suppose was rather cool.

Back to Pirates: In An Adventure With Scientists. It all began with Gideon Defoe's Pirates book. What was it that you initially found so appealing about his work?

What jumped off the page instantly was the comedy, and a sense of fun which I'd never seen before. The story's got a particular tone of comedy which is quite surrealist, a bit absurdist and very modern, even though it's set in the past. It's also very playful and quite mischievous, and I loved the way that the book, and the film, took an enormous comedy swing at Charles Darwin.

So you chose the story that the film was going to be based upon. Where did you go from there?

We spent a long, long time on the story with Gideon in the room, because it's difficult to get a very good story into a defined space of time, which is what you're stuck with when producing a movie. I think we all agreed that, as written, it didn't really add up conveniently to a movie. So first of all we worked on the story, and then we moved on to the designs. You try to imagine what the world looks like, because obviously, in animation, nothing exists. So you have to create everything, from the sky down to the water. Then you start storyboarding, which is a classic animation thing where you turn your script into a visual document. This then adds a whole new layer of humour.

Is there a character in the film with whom you have an affinity?

The Captain, who's obviously very visible. He's on the screen the whole damn time, talking away. He's a very central character, and I like him because he's insanely optimistic and very cheerful, but at the same time has a great lack of foresight, which I guess helps him storm cheerily through life. On the downside, he's very thoughtless and selfish. I like a character who's extreme and by no means perfect. I love his crazy goahead energy, and I loved working with Hugh Grant.

Do you have full creative control when working with Sony, or do you have a spec to which you have to adhere?

It's not either of those. They did give us a free hand, but to be quite frank, that's something that you earn. If they like the script, like the design, and like what you're doing, they give you a free hand. It all worked out really well with Sony, and they just kind of got it. They knew straight away it was quite different to the average film. They knew it was never going to be mainstream, that it was going to be more English, and they loved the fun and the humour that came with it.

Are there any plans to adapt any more of Gideon's books?

Not at the moment. We started work on one, but it's not moved on.

So would you credit Aardman with bringing animation to a wider adult audience?

I think we do - and we delight in that - but we wouldn't take all the credit for it. Creature Comforts and Wallace And Gromit were made for an adult audience - well, a family audience - and I know this probably sounds a bit of a cliche, but we just do what makes us laugh. I think that's the most honest thing you can do.

When you started out, could you ever have imagined that Aardman would become this huge, internationally recognised brand?

No, definitely not. When we started out in the mid-'70s, the world was so different. In those days there were just three TV channels, there was no animation on TV for adults, and nobody made animated movies except Disney. When we started out, what was on offer was probably the summit of our ambition. So a company doing so much, and for so many different audiences, and selling all around the world, was unimaginable.

I remember watching your Morph character being created out of plasticine. Do your creations still start out that way? The final characters that you see on screen are constructed from steel curtains. Their bodies are made from foam latex, silicone, resin, and a little bit of plasticine, but when they're first made we still use plasticine. You can't really sculpt using any other material. Morph works because he's the size he is, so is easy to construct from solid plasticine. He's the cheapest possible animation puppet. When things begin to get more complicated, the whole thing breaks down and the puppet doesn't work anymore. Our puppets are designed for looks first and foremost, and then very skillful modelmakers do the job to make them fit for purpose.

Do you try to push boundaries as far as technology and the art form is concerned?

With the boundaries thing, we always think there's a solution if you want it. So if you come up with an idea for, say, your characters to be transparent, we may say 'that's a stupid idea', or we may say 'we'll go with this idea because there's always a way you can make it work'. When we make films, it's fundamentally done the same way as it's always been done, with puppets and cameras in the studio. That said, we do use a lot of digital technology to help us, especially around the edges.

Which has been the most challenging character you've worked on?

Big characters are always a challenge, purely because of their size. In Chicken Run, you have humans interacting with chickens, so the scale of things is very important. We had this massive Mr Tweedy character, who wasn't much bigger than some of the chickens, and that was a bit of a challenge.

Which is your favourite character? I'd say Morph, because he was the first-born, as it were.

Are you still very hands-on with the company?

When you're directing, then yes, you're still

very much hands-on - but that doesn't mean that I touch much plasticine!

What's been the most difficult decision you've had to make professionally?

Making Chicken Run was incredibly difficult, because it was on a much bigger scale than anything we'd ever done before. The studio doubled in size in the space of year. We had to split it in half, because you need a lot of space to do a movie, and space was something we didn't have. Splitting up teams and people was difficult. I personally went off to the feature studio, which is in the north of Bristol, away from headquarters, and I lost, or should I say missed, a lot of people and friends who I'd been working with for years. That decision put a huge strain on the company at the time, but it proved worthwhile in the end.

So we've got the Shaun The Sheep movie coming in 2015. Any plans for any more Wallace And Gromit?

Nothing live at the moment. I always assume they'll be back, because there's lots that we can do with them. Nick's working on another film at the moment, which isn't Wallace And Gromit.

What is it?

A deadly secret project...

Sounds interesting! So what's taking up most of your time at the moment?

I'm working on development, which is when you take an idea through to production. I don't know whether I'll actually direct one, but we've got three or four things, including Nick's film, on the boil. We're trying to get them off the ground and into production, and that's a big deal. It means you've got to get all the money in place, all the team in place, and you've got to get the studios to believe in your project. It's what we work for. It normally takes a couple of years for that thumbs-up or green light, as it's called.

And your greatest achievement; would that be Wallace And Gromit?

It would have to be the studio, I think, because, as I said earlier, we could never have imagined achieving this, and there wasn't any other model to follow. So to have built this studio, which everyone knows the name of and everyone wants to work at, is great. We employ a lot of people, and that's what I'm most proud of.

And that you're still very British...

Absolutely, and that isn't very easy either, I can tell you. We try to make it look easy, but it's tricky out there in the big world.

You've worked closely with both Dreamworks and Sony. Have they ever tried to tempt you to relocate to the US? They've tried, but we've never, ever been tempted.

As well as showcasing crafted sets and puppets from the film, The Pirates! In An Adventure With Scientists exhibition also includes hand-on activities for all ages and the chance to see the renowned Oxford Dodo. Pirates!... shows at **Thinktank**, **Birmingham**, until end of September 2013

Bonnie Raitt

Symphony Hall, Birmingham, Tues 11 June

American blues singer-songwriter, slide guitar player and lifelong political activist Bonnie has racked up over forty years of musicmaking, her early-career roots-influenced albums giving way in the 1980s and '90s to more commercially accessible recordings. A ten-time Grammy Award-winner, she's perhaps best known for 1990s numbers Nick Of Time, Something To Talk About, Love Sneakin' Up On You and I Can't Make You Love Me.



I See Hawks In LA

Henry Tudor House, Shrewsbury, Mon 24 June; Kitchen Garden Cafe, Birmingham, Sun 7 July

This laidback country rock group hail from sunny California. Promoting their own brand of Americana across the globe, from SXSW to not-so-sunny Shrewsbury, they've released six albums since 2001. Influenced by country artists such as Merle Haggard, George Jones and Buck Owens, and folkier singer-songwriters such as Bob Dylan, they've been called "a talented, literate bunch of soulful musicians (that) create honest and wise roots music for the ages." They stop off in the Midlands as part of an eighteen-date UK tour.



Whole Lotta Led

The Place, Oakengates, Telford, Sat 22 June; Ludlow Assembly Rooms, South Shropshire, Sat 27 July

If Whole Lotta Led don't reign supreme when it comes to high-quality tribute acts, they're certainly up there vying for top spot with the very best of 'em. Dedicated to recreating the classic studio and live albums of the legendary Led Zeppelin, they've chalked up a staggering one thousand-plus concerts since forming in 1993 - irrefutable evidence, were any to be needed, of just how fantastic a job they do of paying homage to one of rock music's greatest ever bands.



Rihanna

LG Arena, Birmingham, Mon 17 June & Thurs 18 July

Barbadian-born Rihanna has enjoyed a meteoric rise to stardom since bursting onto the scene with her debut studio album Music Of The Sun in 2005. Two years later things really took off for her, courtesy of Good Girl Gone Bad and its chart-topping singles Umbrella, Take A Bow, Disturbia and Don't Stop The Music. In 2012, American magazine Time named Rihanna one of the world's most influentual women. Proving her international popularity, the Rude Boy star has no fewer than five American Music Awards, eighteen Billboard Music Awards, two BRIT Awards and five Grammy Awards under her belt.

The Who: Quadrophenia

LG Arena, Birmingham, Fri 28 June

This concert sees The Who perform their iconic Quadrophenia double album in its entirety as part of a twelve-date UK tour. Released in 1973, Quadrophenia was the band's second rock opera (after Tommy) and went on to become one of the most influential albums in the history of rock music. The new concert version has been personally directed by Roger Daltrey. Focusing on the original album, it replaces the narrative used in previous stage incarnations with powerful imagery projected on an array of massive screens. The Who's founding members Roger Daltrey and Pete Townshend will be joined for the show by Zak Starkey (drums), Pino Palladino (bass), Simon Townshend (guitar/backing vocals), John Corey (keyboards), Loren Gold (keyboards/backing vocals) and Frank Simes (musical director, keyboards/backing vocals).



MUSIC PREVIEWS

Peter Murphy

O2 Academy, Birmingham, Mon 17 June Nicknamed the Godfather of Goth, Peter Murphy is best known for his work with Bauhaus, with whom he performed before going solo. The group formed in 1978, and were influential in the field of gothic rock, achieving UK chart success and worldwide cult status before disbanding in 1983, since which time they've reformed on a couple of occasions. In celebration of the band's thirty-fifth anniversary, Murphy will play only Bauhaus material on this new Mr Moonlight tour, which takes in a whopping forty-nine dates in North America and Europe over a three-month period.



Josh Groban

Symphony Hall, Birmingham, Mon 17 June

Josh Groban has become something of a classical music darling, selling over twenty-five million albums in the last twelve years. Renowned for his stunning vocals, Josh is also an actor, and has appeared on US TV show Ally McBeal and in the movie Crazy.Stupid.Love. With his curly hair and boyish looks, the thirty-one-year-old star has captured the hearts of fans worldwide, and even snared Mad Men's January Jones. He's touring in support of sixth studio album All That Echoes, which hit the number one spot on the Billboard charts last November.



Lambchop

Warwick Arts Centre, Coventry, Wed 26 June Playing country music since the 1990s, Lambchop are fronted by Kurt Wagner, have a fluid line-up, and released their eleventh studio album, Mr M, last year (the album was dedicated to Wagner's late friend and collaborator, singer-songwriter Vic Chesnutt). Kurt is famed for his songwriting, his lyrics having been described as "witty and deeply insightful". The band's use of multiple backing musicians creates a big sound, presenting a sharp contrast with the often-stripped-back approach to country music.



Neil Young And Crazy Horse

LG Arena, Birmingham, Tues 11 June

One-time Crosby, Stills & Nash member Neil Young has been playing music for forty-plus years, a period during which he's released thirty-plus albums, garnered a reputation as one of rock'n'roll's greatest songwriters and performers, and twice been inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame; in 1995 for his solo work and in 1997 as a member of Buffalo Spring-field. Although he's experimented with various musical styles, he's best known for playing acoustic and electric music, the latter very often in collaboration with American rock band Crazy Horse, with whom he's here reuniting for the first time in nine years.

John Lee Hooker Jr And His All American Band

The Robin, Bilston, Tues 18 June

Blues musician John is perhaps best known for being the son of highly influential twentieth century singer-songwriter and guitarist John Lee Hooker. That's not to say the Detroit-born Junior hasn't made a significant mark of his own, earning Grammy award nominations for his engagingly contemporary

arrangements. A one-time resident of San Quentin jail, Hooker Jr's found God and cleaned up his act during the last few years, but brings a real sense of his hardlivin' past to his modern-day business of musicmaking.



Sir Cliff Richard

Warwick Castle, Sat 8 June

If you add up all the time that Cliff's songs have spent in the charts, the total comes to a staggering twenty years. No wonder the Peter Pan of Pop remains one of the UK's most-loved performers! Expect all the old

favourites from five decades-worth of song, including Move It!, Livin' Doll, Congratulations, Devil Woman, We Don't Talk Anymore, Wired For Sound, Mistletoe And Wine and heaven knows how many other memorable hits.



Chapel Club

The Institute, Birmingham, Mon 3 June

After recently selling out London's Electrowerkz, Chapel Club are kicking off a five-date UK tour with this Birmingham show. The London quintet's new album, Good Together, will be released on the same day as this Institute gig, and, in a move away from the indie rock sound of debut offering Palace, boasts a far more electronic feel. The psychedelic video for the title single has been directed by Ollie Murray, the man behind videos for both The Horrors and Totally Enormous Extinct Dinosaurs.



Cara Luft

The Hive, Shrewsbury, Sun 16 June; Kitchen Garden Cafe, Birmingham, Tues 18 June

Founding member of Canadian folk trio The Wailin' Jennys, Cara's solo sound has been moulded by such diverse influences as '80s pop music, folk music, church music and, er, Led Zeppelin! She kick-started her musical career at the tender age of eleven when she decided to teach herself how to play the guitar, since which time she's taken massive strides both as a musician and a performer. Presenting what she describes as 'rockin' folk for the discerning listener', Cara's natural warmth and delicious sense of humour ensure that an evening in her company offers much, much more than some spellbindingly good musicianship.

A Nigerian singer, and leader of the Yoruba Women Choir, Funmi Olawumi brilliantly mixes afrobeat, juju, highlife and fuji music and all in the name of faaji. Faaji is a Yoruba word for 'having a good time', and Funmi certainly knows how to give her audiences just that, courtesy of a show that also features high-energy dance routines.



Bo Bruce

The Glee Club, Birmingham, Tues 25 June

You'd be forgiven for thinking Bo Bruce was the winner of The Voice 2012, as in some ways she was. Despite finishing in second place, the speculation surrounding her relationship with mentor Danny O'Donoghue kept her in the spotlight. With a cover of Kate Bush classic Running Up That Hill receiving praise from the lady herself, it's no surprise her album, Before I Sleep, made the top ten.



Tegan And Sara

The Institute, Birmingham, Wed 12 June

Bringing together indie rock, New Wave, indie pop, indie folk and synthpop, Canadianborn identical twin sisters Tegan Rain Quin and Sara Keirsten Quin started writing and playing songs together at the tender age of fifteen. Their first independent full-length album, 1999's Under Feet Like Ours, caught the attention of Neil Young's iconic manager Elliot Roberts, and it wasn't long before the twins were making big waves on the international music scene. O2 Academy, Birmingham Despite hailing from our side of the pond, support act Kassidy seemed to confuse the crowd. A hairier version of Kings Of Leon, the Glasgow boys looked like they could've been extras in the Just Ride video. However, their gruff country sound was perfectly evocative of the faded heyday of Americana that Lana Del Rey sells so well. Onto a stage decorated with lion statues, palm trees, candelabras and columns, Lana meekly stepped forward. Dressed in an innocent




white lace dress and sneakers, she oozed allure from every pore as she sang those immortal lines from Cola. Sliding against the guitarist during the dark and sultry Body Electric, she was showered with compliments by the audience, from the flattering to the crude. Answering their calls with fluttering eyelashes and a breathy voice that could've come straight from the mouth of Gatsby's Daisy Buchanan, as played by Carey Mulligan, it was evident the 'gangsta Nancy Sinatra' years were well and truly behind her. Sauntering cat-like and delicately around the stage, she left the crowd breathless with renditions of Carmen, Summertime Sadness and Born To Die, whilst a lead up of Without You into Knockin' On Heaven's Door added plenty of street cred. With a hush descending upon the crowd for Young And Beautiful and Ride, her voice shining against the string quartet and piano, she played the part of lovelorn glamour queen to perfection. Having gained confidence since her early performances, Lana really is a picture-perfect American queen. Steve Earle

Symphony Hall, Birmingham

Three times Grammy Award-winning musician, actor, author and activist Steve Earle is one of the greatest singer-songwriters of his generation, and regarded by many to be the Godfather of alt-country. Equally at home as solo artist or band member, Earle's recent gig in Birmingham, with his highly acclaimed electric band The Dukes, was nothing short of superb. It was the first night of the British leg of his European tour, and what a way to start. Opening with the



title track from new album The Low Highway, Earle launched into what's best described as a road trip of America. Old favourites Copper Head Road, The Gallway Girl, My Old Friend The Blues and the achingly rendered Remember Me, written for his autistic, three-yearold son, were amongst the highlights, with a rousing encore of The Revolution Starts Now bringing proceedings to a close. Special mention must go to Chris Masterson (guitar and pedal steel) and wife Eleanor Whitmore (vocals and fiddle), integral members of The Dukes. 

Holst: The Planets


Symphony Hall, Birmingham, Sat 15 June

Forming part of the Birmingham International Concert Season, this Philharmonic Orchestra performance of a truly memorable work is the finale of the Town Hall and Symphony Hall's Universe Of Sound project. A firm favourite with UK audiences and one of the most recorded pieces of British music, Holst's seven-movement orchestra suite is a depiction of each of the astrological planets known to man at the time of the work's conception (between 1914 and 1916). Acclaimed Icelandic/Russian conductor Vladimir Ashkenazy (pictured) is the talent at the helm of this particular performance, and is accompanied by James Ehnes on violin and the Ladies of the Birmingham City Choir. Other highlights in the Universe Of Sound project include a digital installation at Birmingham Municipal Bank, which runs until 16 June; an accompanied screening of 2001: A Space Odyssey at Symphony Hall on 14 June; and a Universe Of Sound Family Day at Symphony Hall on 15 June.





As You Like It

Royal Shakespeare Theatre, Stratford-upon-Avon

The audience may begin their evening sat in the main house at Stratford, but by the end of this transformational production they're crowd-surfing at Glastonbury!

The subject of living outside the rules of society is at the heart of Shakespeare's As You Like It - so modern-day alternative lifestyles and back-to-nature activities give director Maria Aberg plenty of scope to revel in the comic potential of people stumbling out of their comfort zone.

While brutal courtly life is defined by staged beatings and sharp tailoring, Cliff Burnett's banishedbut-cool Duke Senior is like an old artschool rocker, heading a commune in the Forest of Arden. There's a well-stocked beer-cooler or piece of fruit for every character, including Nicolas Tennant's grubbily amusing Touchstone and Oliver Ryan's dreamily melancholic Jaques, who sniffs out the potential for sadness inherent in each drifting encounter. In fleeing to the forest, Pippa Nixon's vivacious Rosalind has been freed from courtly feminine discipline, only to be constrained by her disguise as Ganymede, a kind of fresh-faced male lifecoach. Alex Waldmann's likeable Orlando comes across as a thoroughly good bloke who naively submits to alternative therapy from Ganymede to cure him of his desire for lost love Rosalind. The inevitable outcome is Rosalind's 'magical' return at an energetic outbreak of pagan weddings.

The 'Five Go To A Festival' visual comedy may be laid on thick, but arguably mirrors Shakespeare's hardly subtle joke to his city audiences that lions and palm trees were common in rural Warwickshire.

Laura Marling's enjoyable folk settings of the song verses work equally well in moments of torchlit yearning or rousing community singalongs, underlining the contrast between the lusty energies of the sunlit forest and the trance-like gloom of normality. *David Barron*

The Woman In Black

Malvern Theatre

The more times I see The Woman In Black, and the further back in the auditorium I sit while watching it, the less I like the play.

Adapted by Stephen Mallatratt from the Susan Hill ghost story, it was first performed in 1989, and is one of the West End's most successful plays - a fact which makes my ever-developing distaste for it all the more baffling. A regular tourer, it's been given a publicity boost of late by the movie version, and continues to put bums on seats; which rather begs the question for me - can so many theatre-goers be so wrong about it?

If I'm going to be completely honest, I find the play boring. This current touring version seems even less inspiring to me than previous productions, but I do wonder whether it's an offering best appreciated when you're nearer to the action than Row Q. There's a sense of intimacy about the piece that seems to get lost in translation from the stage to the farther reaches of the auditorium.

Malvern Theatre's a lovely place in which to watch a show. I just hope the next time I go there I'm able to enjoy whatever I'm watching on stage as much as I do my visit to the venue itself.



Sutra

Birmingham Hippodrome

Created in 2008, Sutra, meaning 'a rope or thread that holds things together', is one of Sadler's Wells' biggest productions. A logistical nightmare, the show is the brainchild of dancer-choreographer Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui, and brings together sculptor Anthony Gormley's visual design, Szymon Brzóska's reflective music and sixteen Shaolin warrior monks/contemporary dancers, all under Sidi's mindful direction. The milieu begins with Sidi and a child monk sat separated by a pile of sixteen small wooden blocks, one for each box, each of which, in turn, contains a monk. Sidi is at first puppet-master, then voyeur, then participant in this graceful game.

The beauty of the Gormley-designed boxes lies in their simplicity. Alone, the boxes resemble coffins, carried around by their respective owners; together, they're transformed into a lotus flower, a boat, plinths, a bunk-bed, dominoes and a prison. The monks move with the grace of dancers, their kung-fu kicks and leaps carried out with a studied and impressive discipline. A blend of East and West, the piece studies the intersection between art and religion. The quiet, contemplative nature of the dancer monks sits well against the stunning live music that emanates from behind a semi-transparent screen.

A captivating piece, the stand-out star is undoubtedly the eight-year-old child monk who visually narrates the show whilst keeping up with his animated older brothers. Brilliant. *Alev Dervish*





Ludlow Fringe Festival




Upton International Jazz Festival

Various locations around Birmingham, Tues 11 - Sun 30 June







Those Bohemian artists, what are they like? Here, in this adaptation of Jonathan Swift's



Like Someone In Love

CERT 12a (110mins)

Starring Tadashi Okuno, Rin Takanashi, Ryo Kase Directed by Abbas Kiarostami (Japan/France)

Some consider the Iranian-born Abbas Kiarostami to be one of the greatest filmmakers working today. This character study, set in contemporary Tokyo, certainly exhibits the director's mastery of his medium. Echoing Yasujirō Ozu's consummate Japanese masterpiece Tokyo Story (with its reflections on the rural/urban and generational divide), Like Someone In Love (its title taken from the 1957 standard sung by Ella Fitzgerald) is a mesmerising, melancholy fable. With its exquisite attention to detail - its play of light and incidental sound - the film builds up an almost enigmatic scenario in which anything might happen. At the story's centre is the unhappy Akiko (the hauntingly beautiful Takanashi), who stands up her grandmother to spend the night with a distinguished gentleman who is mistaken for her grandfather. The acting is superlative, and you'd be hard put to find as poetic, humane and surprising a film this year. Indeed, this could be Kiarostami's finest film to date.

Classic Italian, in vogue...

At the corner of Brindleyplace and Oozells Square is Piccolino, an Italian restaurant with a contemporary and stylish interior. The kitchen looks out into the restaurant, allowing diners a peek at the busy chefs and the wood-burning oven. But it was the heated terrace that took our fancy - the novelty of eating alfresco on a rainy evening couldn't be resisted. The outside seating is on low but comfortable sofas, although my dinner date found it a little cramped, as he's taller than average. While perusing the menu, we shared fresh baked herb focaccia and crusty Tuscan bread with the obligatory olive oil and balsamic dip. On the recommendation of our friendly waitress, we ordered some olives; the greenest olives I'd ever seen. Sicilian and bursting with flavour, they were delicious.

To start, I chose Carpaccio (£9.95), which came with parmesan and rocket salad. The well-matured beef had been seared before being sliced, which added an extra depth to the flavour. The accompanying Venetian dressing was light and lemony, and offered a wonderful contrast to the beef. My companion had Costatine (\pounds 7.95), barbecued short pork ribs in a smoky sauce that had a cheeky chilli kick.

My main was Branzino (£18.95) - a succulent sea bass with a scrumptiously crisped skin, served straight from the wood stone oven, with lemon, garlic and parsley. It was sublime. My partner went for risotto with Tuscan sausage, fennel and basil (£11.95). There was a fine balance between the fennel and basil. Overall the risotto was creamy and smooth, with a perfect bite to the rice. We shared a side of zucchini frites; thin strips of courgette fried in a light batter, they were an ideal accompaniment for both dishes. The meal was pleasantly lubricated by a Cortese, Araldica, Piemonte 12 (£18.95), a beautifully dry, lemony white wine from northern Italy.

Unfortunately we couldn't

stay to try the desserts, though I did fancy the torta al cioccolato - a chocolate, bitter orange and almond tart.

Throughout the meal our waitress was personable, efficient and knowledgeable when it came to the menu and specials. In hindsight, the terrace wasn't such a good idea on a wet evening. Although it was warm and comfortable, the square was wet, grey and lacking in atmosphere. I found myself wishing I was inside. The food itself was classic Italian fare, perfectly cooked. My choices were uncomplicated dishes in which the simple ingredients combined to create delectable flavours. I'd happily return - and next time have the torta al cioccolato. Ted Finlay

Restaurant REVIEWS

A warm welcome and fine British cuisine...

A newcomer on the Shropshire restaurant scene, The Glutton Club opened its doors last November. Situated in Frankwell, Shrewsbury, the restaurant's owners initially intended it to be a pop-up restaurant which would only be open for a month. But it seems that its popularity has convinced them to commit to something more long-term. In its short life, the Glutton Club has garnered a reputation for good food from a modern British menu, so our expectations were high when we booked our table. On arrival, I found the restaurant to be smaller than expected, with a basic décor. Warmly welcomed and shown to our table, we ordered drinks and starters, which took a while coming. I opted for baked Camembert with toasted sourdough bread and a home-made pickle consisting of carrot ribbons and cauliflower florettes, which were deliciously spiced and had a good bite. My dining partners had the trio of lamb, made from a combination of lamb cutlet, crispy belly and ballotine of shoulder, all of which, I was informed, were perfectly cooked, tender, and wonderfully seasoned.

Again, there seemed to be an unnecessary length of time for our next course to arrive. I'd chosen fish - a salt-baked lemon sole served with buttered new potatoes, wilted spinach and capers. The fish was sublime, and the accompanying vegetables fresh and well seasoned, but the slate on which it

was served didn't quite hold the heat, so the dish quickly went cold. The sharing platter of beef rib enticed my fellow diners. It was ordered medium rare and came fabulously presented with a side of triple fried chips and roasted tomatoes on the vine. Again, my friends reported their food to be mouthwateringly delicious.

The lemon posset was the choice of dessert for us all. It was served with vanilla shortbread and topped with rhubarb syrup - and arrived quickly! The posset was sublime; light and tangy, smooth and creamy. The shortbread and rhubarb were ideal partners.

Though the staff were pleasant, and knowledgeable when it came to the menu, I felt they could have been more attentive and noticed the waiting times. The décor is very much a work in progress, and over the next few months I'm sure its style will become more clearly defined. The quality and flavour of the food, though, was fantastic. Ted Finlay


