An actress who started out as a member of the Belgrade Youth Theatre is returning to the Coventry venue this month to star in William Inge's classic American drama The Dark At The Top Of The Stairs. Jenny-May Darcy, whose post-Belgrade Theatre drama training saw her spend three years at the Courtyard Theatre in London, has appeared in numerous TV commercials and music videos, and is very much looking forward to returning to the Midlands. "Growing up as an aspiring actress in Coventry, the Belgrade was always a huge part of my life," says Jenny-May. "I'm thrilled to have landed this role in The Dark At The Top Of

The Stairs - and to be performing it at the Belgrade really is the icing on the cake. It feels like I've returned to my roots; to the place that first inspired me to want to act, over a decade ago."



#### Holby City star in Birmingham

Celebrated actor Hugh Quarshie, best known for his role as Dr Ric Griffin in Holby City, recently paid a flying visit to Birmingham to promote the forthcoming sixth annual Music Video & Screen Awards. Hugh, together with Tameka Empson (Kim Fox in EastEnders), will host the awards ceremony at the city's prestigious International Convention Centre on 27 October. The event forms part of Birmingham's Black International Film Festival, which runs from 22 to 28 October.





#### New dimension for Solihull festival

A popular event in the Midlands' culinary calendar has been given a new look for 2012. This year's A Taste Of Solihull features themed music and theatre performances as part of a three-day celebration of the town's gastronomic delights. Live performers on the main stage include Birmingham Conservatoire's Harper String Trio, Irish dancers performing alongside O'Neill's chefs, Latin-influenced street dancers strutting their stuff with Nando's and Eastern-inspired dancers accompanying a sushi making masterclass by Yo Sushi. Many of the performances are by talented local youngsters from Starstruck Theatre School and Learning Curves school of Dance. Other festival attractions include cooking demonstrations from more than twenty restaurants at a live Demo Kitchen in Mell Square, exclusive offers at restaurants across the town, three food markets (an Italian, a Farmer's and a Chilli), craft activities and mask making by Giraffe restaurant, and Japanese writing sessions by Wagamama. Solihull resident and performer John Innes - often referred to as 'The People's Tenor' - will also be present, performing two opera arias in Mell Square on the Sunday. 
to bring internationally-known players to rural Shropshire. One of the biggest attractions for them is The Edge's enthusiastic and loyal audience."

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# Rob Rouse

talks comedy, kids and teaching...

Boasting a plethora of TV credits, including Channel Four's 8 Out Of 10 Cats, ITV's Celebrity Juice and Dave's One Night Stand, Rob Rouse peddles a hyperactive brand of humour that's much in demand. What's On caught up with the award-winning comedian to find out what audiences can expect from his latest UK tour...

#### When did you first realise that you were funny?

I don't really know. Probably when I was a child, but maybe I just thought I was funny. There's a real difference between thinking you're funny and then realising that you're funny, which, let's be honest, is always up for debate, isn't it? There's also a real difference between being a funny person and being funny for people on a stage. There are comedians who are funny in real life and funny on stage, and I hope I'm one of those, and there are people who are not funny at all off stage, but who are very funny on stage. Some people find masks, I think,

and they can work out how to be funny. And then there are people who are utterly unaware that they're hilarious and can't do it on stage. I like to think that I'm somewhere in between. I'm a bit of a natural clown, and that's part of what I bring to what I do, but I try to focus it.

#### So does comedy consume your whole life?

Hopefully not. I'm hugely lucky not to have a real job, which is the way I look at it. Something that essentially used to get me told off at school now earns me a living. Genuinely, that's how it feels - to a certain

degree anyway. There's stuff that I wasn't meant to say at school, or things that I wasn't meant to say at work, that I can now say on stage and have people go, 'that's great!', rather than 'fire that man!'. I feel very lucky to have a job where I can express myself like that. I can arse about, I can say exactly what I want, regardless of how offensive people may or may not think it is. As long as I'm accountable for what I say, then I can do it. Without being churlish about it, it feels like a very healthy way for me to live my life.

## You trained to be a geography teacher, so how did the transition into comedy come about?

I was kind of bullied into it by some mates in a pub one night. They said they'd done a charity comedy night the evening before and reckoned I'd be alright at it. I was very drunk, agreed to do it, and absolutely loved it. I was aware that I was in a partisan crowd of people who wanted it to work for me and who knew each other, but there was something inside me that was completely overwhelmed by the incredible feeling I got from the moment. I think it's a very special gift to be able to make people laugh, and it's certainly addictive. I decided it was something that was worth doing. Not that teaching wasn't, but it made me realise that there was a series of decisions that I was making by default. I thought I could have a crack at it and it would be my thing entirely, so I rebelled at twenty-five. I stuck it to the man late. Most people do it when they're fifteen, but I waited another ten years.

## You won So You Think You're Funny? in 1998 - how much has your comedy evolved since then?

Quite a lot, really, because I've changed. I'm a very different person now to how I was back then. I now have two children, and my life is very different to how it was, and that changes you as a person. Back then, my act was nonsense, it was just bolted together and was quite madcap, high-energy stuff. Now it's a lot more autobiographical, but I think it's a lot better and a lot funnier than it used to be, because the stuff I now talk about is real. It's my life, and I know what I'm talking about. I also know who I am more.

# Obviously, being a parent provides you with plenty of material, Do you ever worry that one day your kids are going to look back and say, 'God dad, why did you use me?'

Absolutely, but I'd say, 'well, you weren't going to get a job, were you? You weren't going to feed yourself, you weren't going to let your dad retire at thirty-eight and put his feet up, were you? No, you were just a normal, lazy, selfish four-year-old who needed feeding, clothing and a roof over his head. So what else was I going to do? And you just shat on me'. So somehow I'm going to have to get something out of that.

#### What's the biggest sacrifice that you've had to make along the way?

I suppose the biggest sacrifice is that I work weekends, when most of my friends and family are off. I sacrifice time, but at least the time that I spend doing my job, I'm enjoying myself. If you put this question to my wife, she'd probably give you a list as long as all of the arms in China, I should imagine. So yeah, it's just time, and the time I spend away. I just try to make the most of it when I'm at home. Balancing life is a human condition, and it's tough for most people.

## When preparing new material, is there a certain time or place where you're most creative?

Not really. I just scribble stuff down. I think things through when I'm travelling, or wherever and whenever I can. Inspiration comes from the strangest places at the oddest times, and you've just got to embrace it when it's there; try and make some sense of it. You can do comedy one of two ways. You can find a very safe way of

writing and just do that same material again and again, or you can constantly put yourself in a position of possibly failing by trying stuff out all the time. That's why I love to tour each year, because unless you throw stuff away, you'll never write new stuff. I try to grab it when it's there, make the most of it, and play it out in front of an audience at gigs and previews.

#### Apart from your kids, what other themes do you favour in your work?

Things that you love or hate. It tends to be things that you're drawn towards because you've got frustration, elation or confusion around those things. For me, anything that feels weighty and dramatic in reality is good stuff to get into. Anything that's a bit uncomfortable to talk about is always good stuff for comedy, because you're not just doing safe stuff. I think there's a place for everything, but I think when you're doing live stuff, you should be pushing what you can do. In this new show, there's literally thirtyfive minutes about poo, and I think it's one of the best shows I've ever done. For anyone to be offended by it, they'd have to be nuts, because that's the joy - doing it and getting people to lose their inhibitions and come with it. There's a lot of poo in my life at the moment, so there's a big chunk of it in the

#### Is there ever a subject that's totally off limits?

I guess it depends on who you are and what you do, but I don't think that any subject should entirely be off limits. You can talk about anything, but you have to take responsibility for what you say and you have to allow people to react in the way that they do and accept that that will happen. If you can deal with that, and your conscience is okay with it - and if you're a good person then it should be alright. I don't think certain people in the media should dictate what artists discuss, otherwise you might as well strangle everyone's creativity. It would effectively be taking away free speech.

## You're criss-crossing the country again with this current tour. So where, in your experience, do you find the best audiences - north or south?

I think the whole north/south divide is one of those constructs, or kind of reductive things, that are invented by people in the north or the south who haven't been to the other. I lived in London for years, and every northerner I knew thought it was fantastic. Every Londoner I've met in Manchester, Leeds or Birmingham thinks it's fantastic living there too. These opinions tend to be informed by people who don't travel anywhere and tend to in-breed in their own little streets. But without brown-nosing, I do find the Midlands a fun place. I can't theorise why I find Birmingham such a fun city to perform in. I wonder if it's because it's such a culturally diverse city, and people just seem to rub along quite nicely thank you. It comes across as this big melting-pot with a great sense of humour. People appear to be quite laid back.

#### As a comedian, what's the best accolade you could ever receive?

I think it's what happens when you're doing it. It's the feeling that I get when a gig is flying - that's the top and bottom of it. It's being in that moment, sharing it with your audience and essentially having a great time.

#### And what's been your favourite comedy moment?

Every time you have a gig where you just walk away feeling utterly at ease with everything. Yeah, that's what it is, when I've had a really good gig and I'm on a high.

#### How do you come down from that?

You just have to wait. I drive home and listen to some great music, or just sit until I pass out.

#### You've appeared in numerous TV panel shows. Do you have a favourite?

Not really, they're all really good fun to do. 8 Out Of 10 Cats was great, but I was a lot younger then. Mad, Mad, World was my most recent, and that was good. They were a really nice bunch to work with. I met some really interesting characters and we had a bit of a giggle.

## Apart from the current tour, what other projects are you working on at the moment?

I've written quite a few scripts, and I've got a few of them in with the Baby Cow production company. We're talking with broadcasters about them, which is very exciting. I'm also working on shorts of my own, and trying to shoot things that I've written. That's my next creative goal.

#### Has there ever been a time in the past fourteen years when you've thought about jacking it all in and doing something else? Oh definitely! I think any comic that tells you

there haven't been times when they've fallen out of love with it has either had some sort of miraculous career or is lying. I think, like with everything, you have to be honest with yourself. It's an odd thing to describe yourself as a comedian. On my passport it says comedian, and it's hard to believe that's what I am. At passport control, they ask, 'what is it you do?', and I reply, 'I'm a comedian, so please let me into your country so that I can take the piss out of it'.

#### So if you did decide to jack it in, what would you do?

Well, I've got a chainsaw and an angle grinder. I'd probably look at what I've got in the garage and take it from there.

## Has there ever been a time when you've regretted not pursuing a career in teaching?

No, because I think I would have been an appalling teacher. Name a country and I'll tell you the capital city.

#### Korea.

I don't know.

#### Shocking! I'm so happy you're not teaching my kids.

Exactly. That's why I made the responsible move of not becoming a geography teacher.

# Lesley Joseph

on why supporting Calendar Girls is so important...

Best known for playing Dorian in the much-loved 1980/'90s TV sitcom Birds Of A Feather, Lesley Joseph this month returns to the Midlands to perform in the stage version of Tim Firth's Calendar Girls. What's On caught up with her to talk about why the play remains so popular, and to find out what brings her to the region this Christmas.

#### What's the big attraction of appearing in Calendar Girls?

They offered it to me last year, but it was never something that I'd particularly wanted to do - it was never on my radar. But then I read the play and I thought, "you know what, this is brilliant". It falls between something which is quite hilarious and something which is quite moving. So once I'd read it and met the producer, I decided to do it. I found out who else was performing in it, and they were all people whose work I admired. So we set

about doing it, and it was such a fantastic experience. We all enjoyed it so much that the director has asked the whole cast back, and all but one of us has agreed do it. So everybody knows everybody else really well. It's a great experience, and the audiences absolutely love it.

There's obviously a healthy appetite for the show. Why do you think it remains so popular?

Audiences return to see the show because

they quite like seeing different people in it, but I also think the show does something to them. I don't think there's anyone in this country who hasn't been touched by cancer; either themselves, someone in their family or a close friend. The show aids cancer research, with a proportion of the money going to Leukaemia research, but it also shows something positive coming out of what was a terrible diagnosis. Everybody goes through the horrors of seeing someone dealing with cancer, and this shows it being

dealt with in an incredibly empathetic way. It also makes you laugh, so you leave the theatre feeling good.

#### Who are you playing this time round?

I play Chris, who instigates the whole thing alongside Annie, who's being played by Sue Holderness. We work really well together; we know each other anyway, and it's a lovely partnership.

#### Did you have any initial reservations about getting undressed on stage?

No. To be honest, the only people who really see anything are the people backstage. Out front, everything is pretty much covered - you see a certain amount, but not as much as we see on stage. It's fine anyway, because the majority of actors spend most of their time in their dressing rooms getting dressed in front of other people, so that's not really a problem.

#### You recently had a big theatre success with the resurrection of Birds Of A Feather. What was your initial reaction when approached about the stage adaptation?

We all spoke and said we'd love to do it - but then, when we did, it was unlike anything I'd ever done in my life. It was sort of about the play, but it was as much about seeing the three of us together again.

#### Were you surprised by the audience reaction?

Yeah, we were slightly surprised by how great it was. Some nights, the laughs were absolutely huge, and we were just thrilled that people loved it so much. To put a half-hour television show, or sometimes an hour-long Christmas special, on stage is always going to be a slight gamble, because you're not sure whether the construction will hold together for that long, so we were absolutely thrilled that it did.

#### What was the biggest obstacle you had to overcome when performing it on stage?

There wasn't one, really, other than finding the right script. The first script we had wasn't good, but then the original scriptwriters got involved. Once they came on board, everything slotted into place. We'll be changing the set when we bring it back for a second run next year, and we'll also fine-tune what didn't work with the first script. There was such an appetite for the show, and there were so many places that we didn't get to tour last time round - Scotland, Ireland, Southampton and Newcastle, for example. To be honest, I think we could tour it for years.

#### Were you surprised by the audience mix?

It was interesting. There were a lot of young people, but then I suppose some of the teenagers that came to see the stage show would either have been very young when it was originally screened, or may have seen reruns. Back in its day, Birds of A Feather was a show which families would sit down together to watch, and you had the feeling it was appropriate for any age.

#### Did you keep in touch with Pauline and Linda in the intervening years?

Yes. It's quite funny, because we're all manic Scrabble players at the moment, and play against each other on our phones. So wherever we are, we're always doing Words With Friends. It's so funny - and when I wake up in the morning, there's always a new word to find from Pauline. We've become quite competitive.

#### Is it true that there might be a Christmas Special of Birds Of A Feather?

I don't know. The BBC showed some interest in resurrecting it, as they did with Ab Fab. There was talk, but we'll have to wait and see. Maybe next year...

## Has there ever been a worry that playing Dorian would lead to you becoming typecast?

No, it's never been a concern. And if I did become typecast, then that's absolutely fine, because I've had a great career and it's not something I'm going to worry about. Dorian was a fantastic role, and I wouldn't have dreamed of turning it down.

## You mentioned having a great career. It's certainly been very varied. So what's been your most challenging role?

I think it would have to be a Neil Simon play called The Gingerbread Lady, in which I played a drunk who'd fallen off the wagon. That really was quite emotionally draining, and I was on stage for the whole time. Other than that, I'm not really sure. The role I've enjoyed the most would have to be in Humble Boy, which I did about five years ago. I also absolutely adored performing in Annie. All roles are challenging in their own way, but none of them have been like a mountain to climb.

## Your work moves between TV and stage. If you had to choose between the two, which would you prefer?

If I were looking for an easier life, I'd choose television. If I were looking for a more satisfied life, I'd choose stage. The stage was why I entered into this business, but I also love the rules and parameters of television.

## It's an ever-changing industry. What do you think has had the most negative effect during your time in the business?

Reality television. I suspect it's negative in terms of allowing television companies not to put out the same amount of drama. But I suspect we're seeing a bit of a sea-change now. Productions like Downton Abbey have proved that people do still want to see good dramas, they do still want to see good sitcoms and good soaps. They still want their dramas, they want their news - they want all the serious stuff as well. Reality television made it really difficult for actors to get work, because the work thinned out, but I think it's all on its way back again now.

#### You've had your own foray into Reality TV. Do you have any regrets?

No, they've only been minor shows. I've never done the big ones. I could never do Dancing On Ice, Celebrity Big Brother or I'm A Celebrity. It's just not me.

#### Could you ever be tempted?

No, even when they offer a lot of money. It could easily go against you. At the time, it may sound tempting - especially if you could do with the money - but it may not do you any favours in the long run.

# Christmas sees you returning to the region to perform alongside Brian Conley in Robinson Crusoe. It's quite an unusual panto, so can you tell us a bit about your role?

I'll be playing the Enchantress of the Oceanshe's the one who helps Robinson Crusoe find the treasure map. That's about as much as I know at the moment, because we

haven't had script meetings, but I do know that it's going to be huge, beautifully staged, and featuring big musical numbers. It's going to be a spectacular feast, which Birmingham Hippodrome pantos always are. I'm thrilled to be doing it. I've never worked on stage with Brian before, but I once did one of his Dangerous Brian sketches, which, for some obscure reason, saw me surrounded by a python. I hate snakes, so that was a little bit scary!

#### Panto's often described as hard work, so what's its attraction?

I love it! You get great songs, great lighting, great costumes - and an interaction with the audience that fulfills the little bit of me that wants to be a stand-up comedian. It's a chance to live out your fantasies, because everything is so beautiful.

#### And what's your all-time favourite panto?

I love Snow White. I did a great Snow White in Belfast. It's a great panto, because you can be evil and fun at the same time. I also love Cinderella, but I'm really looking forward to doing something which is a bit different this year.

## Seeing you on stage in Birds Of A Feather, it was obvious how little you'd aged over the years. What do you do to keep in condition?

I lost two stone to do Birds. I'd relaxed a little on the old weight front, so I went on quite a strict health and fitness regime. I did a lot of exercise, ate very carefully for about four months, and lost the weight. Now I have a series of exercises that I do to keep toned, and that's basically it.

## Finally, what was the most valuable lesson you learned while filming When I Get Older?

I don't think I learned a lesson so much, I just made various notes to myself. Number one: life goes by incredibly quickly, and you should only ever treat older people in a way that you'd like to be treated yourself - which is something I do anyway, because I do a lot of work with the elderly. It was an absolutely devastating programme to do - depressing and uplifting at the same time. But what I wish and pray for is that lessons from older people are taken on board by the Government, and that money is found to treat them with the dignity they deserve. Most older people had a very different life - a life which didn't offer the benefits that we enjoy nowadays - and their stoicism and bravery is incredible. I sincerely hope measures are put in place that allow every older person to reach the end of their life with dignity and proper care, and that you'll never again read headlines which report that somebody died in hospital through a lack of water, through not being given enough to eat and drink, which happens all the time. It was a tough show to film, but I wouldn't have missed it for the world.

brings her Secret Symphony to the Midlands...



Since bursting onto the music scene in 2003, Georgian-born British singer-songwriter Katie Melua has become one of the UK's best-selling and most successful female recording artists. To date, 2012 has proved to be another big year for Katie, with the release of much-acclaimed fifth studio album Secret Symphony (her fourth with Mike Batt), and her marriage to former World Superbike champion James Toseland. This month sees Katie bringing her Secret Symphony tour to the Midlands, stopping off at Birmingham's Symphony Hall. What's On caught up with her to find out more...

First of all, congratulations on your recent nuptials. Is it true that Mike penned a tune for your wedding?

Yeah, and it was really lovely.

#### Was it a complete surprise?

Well, I did ask him if he wanted to be involved in some way, and he said he'd see if he could get a song together. I hadn't heard it before the day, and he surprised me with it, which was lovely.

So have the recent highs in your personal life inspired you to pen any new material? Not too much recently. The wedding has really taken over my life during the last few months, but there are a few things that I'm working on. I've also been in the studio, recording a few extra tracks for Secret Symphony. It's sort of a winter edition, and should be released late November/early

#### So what can your fans expect from your next release?

December.

Well, it's basically the Secret Symphony album, which came out in March, but with a live recording of a gig I did in Berlin earlier this year. So it's got a full live gig on it and four extra tracks. It isn't necessarily Christmas-themed, but the album is all about the orchestra and the voice reinterpreting certain songs, so it does have a sort of warm feeling, which I think can feel quite Christmassy.

## Secret Symphony saw you rekindle your working relationship with Mike. Was that a bit like a homecoming for you?

Yeah, kind of. Last year, before we started making the record, I really felt I wanted to try something that I knew I was good at, and to work with Mike again and re-explore where we left off. Mike is phenomenal at string arrangements, so I knew he'd be the best person for an orchestra-based album.

# The album is a mix of some of your own songs and tracks from other artists. Did you have a prerequisite when selecting the songs for the album, or was it a case of being bombarded with demos?

A bit of both actually. A thing that I'm always looking for as a singer is a song which is intriguing and a bit mysterious - a song that I'm going to be able to give something to, and one that's going to give me something in return. Something that's ultimately going to take me to a place that I've never been to before. The funny thing is that you can't always see that when you hear a song, whether it's sung by another artist or whether you've just read it in sheet music. So you have to try everything out, and you do become a bit bombarded by everything, but I'm always open to possibilities. You'd be surprised by how much a song can change, from the first listen to the first time you

perform it, and then maybe the fifth time you perform it. You can then go into the studio and something else happens with it. So you have to take things along as far as you can, and get them as close to being finished as you possibly can.

## Have you ever finished a song and then realised you could have enhanced it and taken it to another level?

Sometimes, although what tends to happen is you finish a song, take it to every possible level, and then find you're still not happy with the outcome. There are a couple of songs on Secret Symphony that will never get heard by anyone, because they just didn't hit the spot...

## You once described singing other people's songs as being an intensely personal experience. Can you expand on this?

I think what I was meaning there was that singing other people's songs can be just as personal as singing my own songs. I don't think there's enough appreciation for people who just sing, rather than who sing and write their own material. That's fair enough, but as a singer and a songwriter, I do like performing other people's stuff, because it can take you to places you haven't been to before. It can take your emotions somewhere else. In a way, you're getting into the songwriter's head and heart, and the song is getting into yours. It's a different experience, and it's personal if it touches you.

## Does knowing the songwriter influence your decision to interpret the lyrics in a particular way?

Yeah, I guess so. Although I've never placed much importance on it, because I've really tried to judge the song just on the song. There's a Janis Joplin song I cover called Kozmic Blues. Obviously I never knew Janice, but I came across the song by watching lots of DVDs, and I did kind of feel that I got to know her. So actually knowing her as an artist and being a fan of hers definitely put a lot more pressure on me. I guess I felt very precious about wanting to do the song justice and not tread on her toes in any way, and also to bring the song alive in me. But generally speaking, I hardly ever think about the artist, or the writer, when I'm singing the song.

## Your fourth album, The House, saw you acquire a whole new fan base. Has this created an added pressure to please a more eclectic audience?

Yeah, but you're never really going to achieve that. I think The House was just such an incredible experience for me - both making it and also promoting it and seeing the reaction from fans. I know I'll kind of move back to that creative space at some

stage in the future, but I think you just have to do what feels right at the time.

#### You're about to embark on the Secret Symphony tour. What can fans expect?

Obviously it will include songs from the album, but I'm not one of those artists who's petrified of singing all the old stuff. I know people really like to hear things like Crazy and Nine Million Bicycles, and I love singing those songs, so there'll be some of the old favourites too. The music will be taken equally from the five albums, and I'll be mixing it up a bit from night to night.

#### Going back to the beginning, what's your earliest musical memory?

Oh, that would be when we lived in Georgia. It was my mum playing Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata on the piano one time when the lights had gone out. Georgia was in the middle of a civil war, and times were quite tough. The electricity would be turned off from time to time, but we had a piano in the house and mum would play to me to provide a bit of entertainment. I do remember being inspired by that particular piece of music. I started have singing lessons from the age of seven - not classical, iust contemporary stuff - and the first instrument that I ever learned was the harp. I only had one lesson - the harp began to descend on me, and I became absolutely petrified that it was going to squash me, so didn't go back for a second lesson! Then I had a violin phase and a tin whistle phase before eventually settling on learning the guitar at about the age of seventeen.

#### So are you self-taught on the guitar?

Pretty much so. I had a boyfriend who lent me a guitar when I was seventeen and I wrote Far Away Voice on it - which is a ridiculously simple guitar part - so that was pretty much self-taught. Then, soon after that, I met Mike Batt. He hooked me up with a guitar teacher called Justin Sand, and I had lessons with him for a year or two. I'm certainly not a virtuosic guitarist, but I like writing songs on it.

## Who or what do you regard as your biggest influence in your formative years?

Definitely Eva Cassidy. When I got that first guitar at seventeen, I'd just been into artists like Dylan and Joni Mitchell; really great singer/songwriters from the 1960s and '70s. Having been born in 1984, I'd grown up with pop and R&B - lots of very rhythm-based music. Then, suddenly, melody and lyrics came into my life and I was totally blown away by it. And then I heard Eva Cassidy, and realised that, finally, there was someone from my generation out there who could be compared to Dylan and Joni Mitchell. I was devastated when I learned that she'd passed away. It would have been a dream to have seen her perform live. So Eva really



influenced me with her delivery, her style and her interpretation of classics like Over The Rainbow and What A Wonderful World.

## Your musical style has changed over the years. So what genre would you say best represents the real you?

I don't really like the genre reference, because there are great pieces in every genre, and crap too. That said, I think if I had to be very broad about it, it would be folk or blues, or a weird fusion of the two.

#### You've achieved enormous success in the past ten years. Have you fulfilled your ultimate goal as an artist?

Definitely not. I'm really proud and happy with what I've achieved, the records I've released, and the people I've worked with. I'm also proud about the creative relationships I've established with people like Mike, like William (Orbit) and my band. But no, as an artist I definitely feel like there's a lot more ahead.

## On the subject of collaborations, is there anyone you'd really like to work with in the future?

M.I.A, who I saw live at the Montreal Jazz Festival this summer. I was playing there myself and had a few days off, so decided to watch some gigs. She was just amazing. M.I.A is so far removed from Katie Melua, but I think it could be quite fun.

#### And what would you class as the highlight of your career to date?

Probably playing at the O2 Arena. I'd already played in a few bigger venues as part of a festival, or as part of a bigger lineup, but having the O2 filled with people who'd come just to hear my music was so special.

#### And what about your proudest moment?

That would be playing with Brian May and Roger Taylor from Queen in front of Nelson Mandela in 2004. I grew up with Queen's music, and I couldn't compute it in my mind that here I was playing on the same stage as two musical legends.

#### What about the best piece of advice that you've ever been given?

It's not really advice, but more something that I've heard. 'It's not over till the fat lady sings'. By that, I mean if things are really rubbish or going crap, then it's not really over until it really is over...

#### If you could change one thing about yourself, what would it be?

Probably to be a bit more decisive, as I tend to procrastinate a lot when it comes to making big decisions.

#### Has there ever been a decision that you've made and later regretted?

I don't really believe in regret, but there is one thing. It was when I was in LA a few years ago. Just before Glee came along, I was asked by the guy working on the show if I'd like to work with him. I refused, because I wasn't a big fan of musicals and I didn't really see how I could fit into it musically. Then, suddenly, Glee was huge. It was just massive, really funny, and kind of took the mickey out of itself. So I guess that was maybe a silly decision, not to have gone with that one.

#### How have your priorities changed over the last ten years?

I definitely value family and being at home a lot more than I did before. From pretty much the age of eighteen, I was on the road working and away from my family. I've been a crazy go-getter for the best part of the last ten years, and I think that aspect of my personality has mellowed a little bit. Now I'm married, I realise how important it is to have a base.

#### Where's your favourite place to relax?

At home in London. I love being there, with my husband and my family, hanging out with friends and going to see gigs.

#### Does a lot of your chill time still revolve around music?

To be honest, it revolves a lot more around conversation. I love having a good conversation with people, and the art of good conversation is not something that everyone has. I've got a really good dialogue with my best mate Polly, and we can spend hours talking. She came out to see me for three days when I was touring in Germany earlier this year, and from the moment we woke up to the moment we went to sleep, we talked constantly, putting the world to rights. I've got some great people in my life who I love talking to.

#### If you weren't a musician, what would you be?

A scuba diver, or something to do with marine biology.

#### Why?

I love scuba diving. I've got a Padi Advanced Diving Certificate, and it's just the most incredible thing to do. Life in the underwater world is so precious and so special. I'm pretty horrified and scared when I read about all the crap that we're doing to our oceans

and the different species in the sea, so I'd like to do more to help in that field. This planet is so special, and we all have our roles to play in looking after it.

## The media often refer to your impeccable appearance. How important is styling to you?

Well, it's the industry that I'm in, so it does matter, but obviously I put a lot more energy into the music side of things.

#### So do you have a stylist?

Mike's wife, Julianne Batt, is really good at clothes and knowing where to get hold of really cool things. And having worked with Mike and her for the past ten years, she really knows what suits my particular shape, so helps out a great deal with that side of things. There have been other stylists that I've worked with over the years, but Julianne tends to have been the constant.

#### Will James be accompanying you on your new tour?

He'll come out a few times. Well, more than a few times hopefully, but obviously not on stage...

#### Does he share your musical taste?

Sometimes we overlap, but generally we have quite different tastes. I'm into a lot of indie, '60s folk music and Americana, whereas James is more into heavy rock.

#### What's planned for after the tour?

Well, it'll be Christmas, so time to relax. Then I've got another tour in February in France, and then I guess I'll start looking at the next record.

# Paul Zerdin

brings his many friends to the Midlands...

Comedian and ventriloquist Paul Zerdin is back in the Midlands this autumn with a brand new show - and a brand new character! A three-times contributor to the Royal Variety Performance, Paul's certainly hit the big time since catching a break in the Jonathan Rosspresented Big, Big, Talent Show back in the 1990s. What's On caught up with him to find out what his new show has in store for his ever-growing legion of fans....

## How does new show Puppet Master surpass Sponge Fest, your previous show?

It's funnier. The jokes are better, and without sounding a bit up myself, it's cleverer. I'm using video projection, but people needn't worry that they could've just watched it on television or DVD, there's plenty of great live material too. I don't want to give too much away but it 'accidentally' cuts into CCTV footage of

my dressing room before the show.

Tell me about Puppet Master's host,
your new puppet, Alasdair Rimmer.
He's a slightly washed-up game show
host from the world of variety
entertainment. He'll do absolutely
anything to get back on television, and
muscles his way into the show without me
really wanting him there. He's just so
desperate to get a job and be involved.
He's loosely based on the X-Factor

voiceover guy Peter Dickson, and also Patrick Allen, who was the voice of E4 - it's an affectionate homage to them and their incredible voices. I'm obsessed with voices, so he lets me indulge myself.

#### How do you go about creating a new character?

With an idea in my head and a voice. Initially, I didn't know what he looked like. So I spoke to my puppet-maker. Some people have drug dealers, I've got a puppetmaker. He had a head left over from an Ant and Dec puppet used on an ITV show, which was brilliant - it's massive! We stuck some eyes on, a nose, and just played around with it until he looked cheesy enough. It was great fun, because I haven't done a new character for ages. I found it strangely therapeutic, bringing him to life.

When you think of a joke, how do you decide which character gets to say it? Because Sam is a kid who's about to become a teenager, he's a cheeky little sh\*t, always trying to cross the line and see how far he can push it. He's cocky and full of withering put-downs aimed at both me and the audience, so he's easy to write for. The baby is being led astray by Sam, and is a miniature version, but he's got more to learn. Still, he's cheeky and knows more than he's letting on. Albert is an old man who's losing his hearing, losing his marbles a bit, but he's still more or less in control. He knows more than he's letting on too, he's just playing on the fact that he's eighty-five. The characters are so strong now that I instinctively know which jokes suit who. It's been interesting writing an entirely new show. Sponge Fest evolved over a number of years. I kept taking out bits and putting in new ones, whereas with this one, having only a year to put the whole thing together was difficult. But it made me really focus, and I'm a perfectionist, so it was also perversely enjoyable.

#### As a ventriloquist, can you get away with jokes that other comedians can't?

Yes, and the joke is often at my expense. I've got the luxury of taking the p\*ss out of myself, but through the characters, rather than me just being relentlessly self-deprecating. I can get away with having a go at the audience much more too; you get to be cheekier. Mocking the front row is a trademark of my characters, but I'm evolving my audience interaction beyond that. I've got this new section called 'Ask Albert', where people email in questions to my website, www.paulzerdin.com, and Albert imparts his wisdom. It really opens up the show and makes it more unpredictable.

## After the sell-out success and critical acclaim for Sponge Fest, do you feel pressure to deliver something bigger and better?

Sponge Fest finished with all the puppets coming alive independently of me, all singing and all dancing, and I thought, "how am I going to top that?". My audience knows they're independent; it can't be a surprise anymore. Early on in this show, for example, Albert arrives on his mobility scooter and starts doing a big rap, inspired by the Andrews Sisters. The audience won't question it. So now I'm treating the show more like a live sitcom for the characters. I'm actually developing a sitcom with a production company. But I'm really keen to develop the idea live too, because it works really well.

## You've described your sitcom idea as 'The Muppets meets Seinfeld'. Can you expand on that?

I compare it to Seinfeld because it's about me as a jobbing ventriloquist, focusing on my life and living at home with the characters. They're kind of real in it. You'll see me performing live at the Comedy Store. But then you'll see what happens on the drive home, when I get stopped by the police, and Albert's trying to dob me in, claiming I was speeding. "And by the way officer, you ought to look at the brake light, the bulb's gone!"

So there's this Muppets element too, where it's their own world. Again, you never question the fact that there's a frog hosting a variety show. You just accept it. Earlier this year, I sat down with my producer, we had a big brainstorming session and we worked out the rules for our sitcom, which are basically that there are no rules. It's like when you see Sooty and Sweep on Matthew Corbett's hands, and then a scene later, he wouldn't be there and they'd be hatching a plan against him. My sitcom will be like that, a totally immersive world of Paul Zerdin, complete with its own logic.

## Having established yourself as a variety act, how did you reinvent yourself for the booming stand-up circuit?

I won this TV show, hosted by Jonathan Ross in the 1990s, called The Big Big Talent Show. Nigel Lythgoe was the head of entertainment at ITV and put me on numerous variety shows just as variety was becoming unfashionable, so my timing was a bit out. Still, I got in just at the end and did my own summer seasons in Blackpool - just as they were dying out too! I'd had a taste of showbusiness and wanted more. But I realised that I needed to be in a more credible environment.

I'd already gigged a bit on the stand-up circuit, but I knew I had to be seen at The Comedy Store if I wanted to get on The Royal Variety Performance and the bigger, edgier stand-up showcases on television. So I gave it a go, worked tremendously hard, and it's panned out successfully. It's a great feeling to be able to do everything, from the comedy circuit to big corporate events to performing on cruises and doing pantomimes.

## Does that versatility set you apart from other comedians, especially now that variety is making a comeback?

Coming up in the working men's clubs and holiday camps, then crossing over to the comedy circuit made it easier, because once you can cope in those environments, you can cope anywhere.

Besides, you've got to keep trying different things; pushing yourself. I'm really building up the stand-up aspect of being a ventriloguist, without the puppets. I love it for two reasons. Firstly, I can give my arm a rest during the show! And secondly, it's something that's not been much explored. I did a set a few weeks ago and they asked me not to bring the puppets; they only wanted me to do my 'human dummy' routine, where I put a fake jaw on someone's face and give them a silly voice. But then they changed their minds and asked me to do longer, so I ended up doing fifteen minutes of stand-up, talking about the everyday life of a ventriloquist and just mucking around, pretending the mic was out of sync. It was really liberating.

#### Will you always be a ventriloquist?

I never wanted to be a straight stand-up. As a kid, I watched Paul Daniels and David Copperfield - all those magic shows on television. And that's all I ever wanted, to have a reason to be on stage; to be on television. My reason was to do magic or to

do puppets. I never wanted to simply stand there and just do jokes or moan about things, because I don't have anything to moan about; I've had a really nice life. I want to get the sitcom off the ground, get more television exposure and then see where it takes me.

The emergence of YouTube must have been a welcome development for you, as your act has an immediacy that crosses cultural boundaries and is perfectly suited to three-minute videos. Are you performing more internationally now? I've just done a gig in Buenos Aires, a private dinner in a museum. I flew fifteen hours, did the show, then flew back the following day. And I'm getting asked to do more and more of these; it's wonderful. YouTube can make you truly global. The only downside is that occasionally people are recording gigs on their phone, then posting the footage on the internet. It's a good way to build a fan base but it can spoil surprises when people come to see the show live or watch it on DVD.

#### Is it a drama getting the puppets through airport customs?

I do a bit in my act where I talk about going through the x-ray and them finding a little kid in my bag. In reality, though, I just shove them in a suitcase and they go in the hold, I don't see them until the other end. It's only when I have to change flights that the trouble starts, when the bag doesn't make the connection. I've been reunited with them two days late on occasion. It's a pain, but you get used to it when you travel so much.

## You've appeared on The Royal Variety Performance three times now - does it get

Doing The Royal Variety Performance is exciting because it's a huge show and you're performing in front of members of the Royal Family. The first time I did it, I was a bit too nervous. But the last one, in 2009, I'd done so many shows like it by that point, and I reasoned that it wouldn't change my career dramatically, so I relaxed. Then I went out, tore the arse off it, and it really boosted my career! Sometimes you shouldn't push yourself too hard.

## And you've performed for the armed forces too. Are they an intimidating crowd?

Doing troop shows in Iraq and Afghanistan, they're some of the best gigs I've ever done. I'm like a kid flying into those places. I love helicopters, getting in and out of Chinooks and Sea Kings and being on Hercules aircraft is just mindblowing, I've taken the most amazing video footage of it all. Appearing on stage in front of five thousand troops in the desert, they are honestly great audiences, particularly in Afghanistan. They've got it tough, so when you go out there, they're incredibly grateful. And they want to have a laugh too, because, bloody hell, do they need it.

## You worked with the legendary Kevin Clash, the puppeteer behind Elmo, on the film Muppet Treasure Island. How did that come about?

By accident, really. I'd just finished working as a kids' presenter for GMTV, as myself and

as a ventriloquist and puppeteer. I was a huge fan of the Muppets, Sesame Street and films like Labyrinth and The Dark Crystal, and I discovered that a friend of mine, Simon Buckley, who was responsible for Nobby the Sheep on ITV's Gimme 5, was working on the film. So I arranged to say 'hello' to him, but took my CV and a showreel along just in case. He very kindly took me into the Jim Henson Productions office, to meet Jim's son, Brian, and Kevin Clash, and introduced me as a ventriloquist and great puppeteer. When they discovered I wasn't working for the next month, they said, "yes you are, you're working for us!" That was literally how fast it happened. They didn't even look at my showreel. It was a huge deal to be working on a film like that, and I had a fantastic time. I remember ringing my former agent. He said: "Where are you? I haven't heard from you for a few days". "Oh, I'm at Shepperton Studios." "What are you doing there?" "I'm working on Muppet Treasure Island. And because you didn't get me the job, I'm not giving you any commission!".

## Your parents both worked in radio. Were you always destined to be in showbusiness?

I was obsessed with entertainment from an early age, dressing up in my mum's clothes and pretending to be Margaret Thatcher! I was only six, but my parents realised it was in my blood. They'd both trained as actors, then went into radio and television, presenting and producing. My sister and I were always in and out of studios, it was so exciting - pressing buttons and talking to my mother on the studio floor, hearing her sigh and say "can we do that one more time please?".

I would come home, plug a microphone into my dad's hi-fi system, play records and pretend to be a DJ. When I left school, without any GCSEs, and was working parttime in a magic shop in London, as well as doing children's parties at the weekend and close-up magic at restaurants in the evenings, I did the airport information radio you'd hear near Gatwick and Heathrow. I tried my hand at everything before realising that, actually, stand-up comedy and puppets was the way forward. It took me a while to find my feet.

## You've starred in various TV prank shows over the years. How tempting is it to use your voice-throwing skills to fool people in real life?

Very. Because I spend so much time thinking of scenarios to talk about on stage, and having done so much hidden-camera stuff, I know how much of a laugh you can have with it. Without a camera crew, there isn't much point, but I was at Heathrow last year, on the travelator, with the female voice that tells you to 'mind the step', and someone in front of me didn't and went flying forward, so I just added 'enjoy your trip' on the end. They looked around but I was whistling, minding my own business. I couldn't help myself. Generally, though, I try to keep it just for the job. I don't talk to the puppets offstage either.

#### Is ventriloquism a rewarding career?

Absolutely. But any would-be ventriloquist ought to try to get as many qualifications as possible, because if your showbusiness career doesn't work out, you've got something to fall back on. I can't do anything else; I'm doomed to work in showbusiness. And you have to persevere, no matter how many people say that you can't do it, and no matter many knocks you take on the way. If you think you can do it, you mustn't let anything put you off. It can be a sh\*tty business, but also the best. If you believe you can do it, you're halfway there.

#### Will you be returning to pantomime this year?

I'm at the Mayflower Theatre in Southampton with Nigel Havers, Lee Mead and Julian

Clary in a production of Jack And The Beanstalk. Nigel is the baddie, Julian is the Fairy of the Forest, Lee's playing Jack and I'm his mate, Simple Simon, the village idiot. This is my eighteenth panto and I still absolutely love it. As the comedian, you're the lynchpin, the link with the audience. So I get to write two of my characters in, Sam and the baby, with a little bit of singing and dancing about. Panto is its own special, magical medium, and a lovely way to end the year, socialising with the rest of the cast after a year spent travelling around the country and the world, just talking to myself.

#### Will there be a DVD of your show?

I've got two on the way, Sponge Fest and Puppet Master, but I don't know which is coming out first. Again, I don't want to give anything away but there are some really clever little visual effects in Puppet Master that will look brilliant on the DVD. The mixture of special effects and live performance should work really well.

#### What do you do to relax?

Doing what I do makes me slightly obsessive, and I'm always thinking of ideas. I've got a notepad by the side of the bed and I'll wake up in the middle of the night and write something down. And then, in the morning, I'll look at it and go, "what the hell does that mean?". So I'm always thinking about the next show, but I still enjoy having a good time, going out to nice restaurants. Waterskiing and scuba-diving are my big loves when I'm away from home.

# Bupa great birmingham





















In an age of instant celebrity, opera singer John Craig Innes is living proof of the power of self-belief, hard work and sheer determination. Known as 'The People's Tenor', John is headlining A Taste Of Solihull, a three-day festival of food, music and entertainment which runs from Friday 5 to Sunday 7 October in the town's Mell Square. But whilst John might nowadays pack out concert halls and sing alongside the likes of Katherine Jenkins, only a few years ago he was completely unknown and busking on the streets.

In 1997, at the age of thirty-four, John moved from Scotland to London to forge a career as a singer, but found his lack of formal musical education meant the doors of respected London music schools were closed to him. Rather than give up, John was galvanised into proving he had what it takes to succeed in the music business. He set out on a mission to take operatic music directly to the public, performing on high streets around the country. "I loved it - and still enjoy it today," says John. "It's spontaneous and exciting. You don't know who's going to stop and watch you perform or what their response will be, but I've had so many people tell me that I've brightened up their day.'

In November 2008. John took the bold step of hiring the two thousand, five hundredseat Royal Concert Hall in Glasgow, hoping the same people who watched him busk on the streets of the city would buy a ticket to see him in the theatre too. His gamble paid off. The concert sold out two weeks beforehand, he achieved a standing ovation, and was left with enough profit to help fund a debut album entitled On The Street Where You Live."I started recording in my garden shed," confesses John. "Then I risked my £50,000 life savings to bring in professional help. At one stage I was down to my last £25, so I persuaded a local shopping centre to let me sing. That afternoon, I made £150 selling my CDs!" Today, John regularly performs at high-profile sporting events, and completed a sell-out national tour in 2010. He's also raised thousands for Help For Heroes through sales of a speciallyrecorded album. John will soon depart the UK for concerts in Abu Dhabi and Dubai, but the performance at A Taste Of Solihull this month is a golden opportunity to stay closer to home, with his partner Zoe and sixmonth-old daughter Aria. "I made my home in Solihull after busking there on numerous occasions. In fact, it was while I was busking that I met Zoe. Although it was love that brought me to Solihull, I really do like the town. It's friendly, and the people are lovely. Now that I have a family, it's an ideal place to be."


An award-winning documentary about John's inspiring story has recently been released. Called Can You Succeed In The Music Industry Without Simon Cowell?, it charts his struggle to turn his passion into a career. He hopes it will act as a reality check for young musicians seduced by the X Factor's 'express route' to fame. "I would really like to work with talented youngsters and help them understand the value of working your way up," he says, "gigging whenever you can, building experience and resilience."

You can see John perform at A Taste Of Solihull at 1.45pm on Sunday the 7th. Many of the chefs from Solihull's best-loved restaurants, including Giraffe, the Delhi Restaurant, Wagamamas and Metro Bar & Grill, will be taking to the stage in the Mell Square demo-kitchen to showcase their talents. The event also features two open-air bars and plenty of tasting opportunities, as well as a diverse programme of entertainment which includes the infectious beat of Bollywood, street dancing, a string quartet from Birmingham Conservatoire and talented local pupils from the award-winning Starstruck Theatre School and Learning Curves School of Dance.

"He's an outstanding performer, and I'm really looking forward to seeing the crowds in Mell Square soaking up the Autumn sunshine and enjoying the well-known arias he's going to perform, whilst at the same time sampling the work of some of our very talented chefs."

# Paula Wilcox

expecting great things from her latest role...

## About to tour in a new adaptation of Charles Dickens' most popular story, Great Expectations, actress Paula Wilcox explains why she has every reason to travel hopefully.

Asking Paula Wilcox to recall the moment when she decided that she wanted to be an actress elicits a recollection so vivid you almost feel that you were there.

"I would have been about thirteen, and I went with the school to Manchester's Library Theatre to see Henry IV Part One," remembers Paula, who is about to play Miss Havisham in a national tour of Great Expectations. "We were studying the play at school and it was amazing to me that those words on the page could be transformed by the actors. They became believable characters, and the lines they spoke just sounded so natural I was blown away by the whole experience!"

Inspired to start taking acting classes, Paula got a place in the National Youth Theatre at seventeen. And while many of her fellow students went on to drama school or university, Paula didn't need to. Her ambition to be an actress was attained almost immediately when she was spotted and swiftly offered her first job; a TV sitcom called The Lovers, written by the late Jack Rosenthal and playing opposite the young Richard Beckinsale.

But it was her second job in 1973 for which she is perhaps most widely known. Arguably one of the most famous sitcoms in history, Man About The House ran for three years. But Paula was itching to try her hand at the sort of theatre that had first fired her enthusiasm.

"I kept harking back to seeing Shakespeare, so after Man About The House I went and did masses of theatre," explains Paula, who, as well as receiving critical acclaim for performances at some of the world's most prestigious theatres, has also been on our screens in recent times in shows such as Doctors, Rock & Chips, Emmerdale, and the most recent series of Mount Pleasant on Sky. But it's theatre that has Paula's heart once again, as she takes up the challenge of playing one of Dickens' most famous women. "I know the book really well

because I studied it at school and I'm a big fan of Dickens," enthuses Paula, who says she was honoured to be asked to play Miss Havisham. Rated as the most popular Dickens story of all time in a recent poll by The Guardian newspaper, Paula admits that this particular version, by Jo Clifford, was an especially enticing proposition. "When I got the script it was a bit of an eye-opener. I'm always led by the script, and this is a wonderful adaptation; very succinct, but it doesn't feel at all rushed. It's all told in a very leisurely way, but with nothing wasted; you're always being moved on to another set of characters and another bit of the story. I knew as soon as I read it that I wanted to be involved and that it could be magical." And with 2012 marking his Bicentenary, Paula can see why Dickens has endured. "He was a complicated character himself but he wrote great stories. His characters, even the most straightforward ones, all have back stories. And, of course, he had this massive social conscience."

As for Miss Havisham, Paula confesses to being intrigued by the woman who, having been jilted at the altar, hides herself away, remaining dressed in her wedding finery from that day forwards. "People do shut themselves away emotionally, but when you think of someone closing themselves off physically like that it really is quite extraordinary. I'm interested in this whole thing of someone literally stopping the clocks and not wanting to hear anything about anything."


But as well as being captivated by the set, the adaptation and the character, there's also the lure of a rather special costume. Designed by Giovanni Bedin for the House of Worth (Charles Frederick Worth, who created the first couture house, was a contemporary of Charles Dickens), Miss Havisham's wedding dress is going to be a truly unique creation. "All I know at this stage is that it's going to be quite spectacularly 'out there', and that it's going to be quite

impressionistic," teases Paula, declining to give away anything else.

Interestingly, there's never been a production of Great Expectations staged in the West End. Could the time be right? Certainly Paula hopes so, but in the meantime she's looking forward to touring the show to some of her favourite theatres across the UK, including the New Alexandra Theatre in Birmingham. And with a fifteen-strong cast - including Jack Ellis (evil screw Jim Fenner in TV's Bad Girls) and Chris Ellison (Frank Burnside in The Bill) - it certainly sounds as if this is a big show with wide appeal. "It's very familyfriendly, so I hope lots of kids will come to see it," says Paula. "It's a wonderful story, and there's not a child alive who doesn't identify with Pip, and who isn't frightened by Magwitch and this woman who lives among rat-infested cakes and who has her veil chewed by mice. It's going to be a very extravagant and theatrical experience." Talking of being theatrical, what advice would Paula give to aspiring young actors? "It's difficult to say, but I think those who rise to the top have talent, tenacity, stamina, and all sorts of other things. I suppose I'd say don't give up. These days, every profession is precarious, so just go for it." Pausing for a moment, her next words highlight her natural modesty and immense likability: "It's hard to give advice when you've had a lucky break as I did."

But with a career that continues to flourish, there's undoubtedly more to her achievements and staying power than luck; one suspects that Paula's success has more to do with her being astute, refreshingly grounded and hardworking than it does mere good fortune. Oh yes, and she also happens to be a damn good actress

# Richard McCabe

the older woman's Romeo...



Multi-award-winning actor Richard McCabe has been referred to as 'one of the finest actors of his generation'. An Associate Artist with the Royal Shakespeare Company, Richard this month returns to Stratford-upon-Avon to star in Ben Powers' new production, A Tender Thing. What's On caught up with him to find out more...

#### Can you tell us a bit about A Tender Thing?

What Ben Powers' has done is take Romeo And Juliet and re-imagine it for two older lovers. It's as if they hadn't died when they were young, and you see them as an older couple. It's a story of enduring love, and without being too specific about it, there's an illness that comes between them and tests their love.

#### What do you think is the appeal of presenting Romeo And Juliet in old age?

The funny thing is that the text in Romeo And Juliet is actually suited for older actors. There are so many references to age and death that the transposition doesn't seem forced in any way. What Ben has cleverly done is take all the scenes and jiggle them about a bit. So, for example, Juliet has some of the nurse's speech and I have some of Friar Lawrence.

#### So could you imagine a similar approach with any other of Shakespeare's works?

I guess you could, but I'm not a writer, so I wouldn't know how you would do it. I think this whole thing stems from an older actor going to RSC Artistic Director Michael Boyd and saying, 'I think I'm ready to play Romeo now'. There's this idea that Romeo And Juliet is wasted on younger actors, and it's very much an idea which sparked something with Michael, so he approached Ben to see what he could do in adapting it. It really is guite remarkable how easily the language transposes. For instance, in this production, the balcony scene becomes a special occasion between the two of them - their fiftieth anniversary. It's all the same language and poetry, but when you set it like that, the older actors give it an emotional maturity, almost an ironic commentary on what you're saying. It's a lot more pragmatic.

## You've worked extensively with the RSC. What is it about the company that you enjoy the most?

Working with the works of Shakespeare, really. It's the most wonderful privilege to deal with what are some of the most profound expressions of the human condition that have ever been written. A lot of the time, modern scripts just don't have that incredible power of expression and imagery, so when you return to Shakespeare, it's so wonderful to be back.

## Of all the Shakespeare characters you've portrayed, which has been the most fulfilling?

It's hard to say, because they all have something rather magical and wonderful about them. I suppose Hamlet, which I did at Birmingham. We subsequently toured it, then took it to Elsinore in Denmark, where we performed at the castle where the play is set. Hamlet is such an incredibly rich and varied character that you can never get to the bottom of it. So it's a great role in terms of fascination; there's just so much to him, and you have this feeling that you can never get it quite right.

#### So has Hamlet been your most challenging role?

Yes, I guess so, but what's often harder is to perform Shakespeare's clowns. I remember Autolycus being a particularly difficult part to do, because you have to completely invent a world for this character and what he does. He's a snapper-upper, a sort of con man. So you have to invent this whole world for him, where he goes into a community and completely fleeces them for his own ends. You have to sort of invent this persona and incorporate so many different elements into it, using magic tricks, different accents and different disguises. So that presented its own challenges.

# Your return to the RSC follows a stint on stage as Jim Hacker in Yes, Prime Minister. What are the particular difficulties associated with presenting a theatre version of a TV sitcom, especially one which is three decades old?

What was so brilliant about Yes. Prime Minister is that the writers, Jonathan Lynn and Anthony Jay, collaborated again, and it was as if they'd never put their pens down. It was quite extraordinary. Everyone has a special advisor these days, which they didn't have thirty years ago, so there's a female character that's been introduced, meaning the three of them becomes the four of them. The essential writing was as brilliant as it's ever been, and the updated plot worked terribly well - although it was a bit shocking because it was about procuring an under-aged girl for a foreign ambassador. I remember when that idea was introduced, you could almost hear the audience's jaws dropping. The second half was very different from the TV series, inasmuch as Jonathan Lynn became almost farcical in the writing. I used to say to him, "surely, that's not like the TV series", and he'd say that there was an episode like this when Sir Humphrey was out on a window ledge. And when you look back at it, you realise it was maybe a bit more farcical than we remember.

#### Is it true you started out as a musician? Initially. When I left RADA I couldn't get work

Initially. When I left RADA I couldn't get work as an actor, and so answered an ad in Melody Maker and subsequently joined a rock band. We toured a bit, then that fell through. Then I joined another band, and, again, we toured a bit. When that fell through, I went back to acting. But I went back into acting as a musical director as well as an actor. I was writing music for productions that I was in, and the acting parts just got larger and larger. Eventually, I found that I could no longer combine the two, so concentrated on acting.

#### Tell us about your days with punk band Tenpole Tudor?

I actually joined Tenpole Tudor straight after their chart success. They'd had a bit of a breakdown and a couple of the band members had left, so I joined. I knew Edward Tudor Pole vaguely from RADA -Eddie was a trained actor. I remember this extraordinary creature turning up in the bar wearing two ties, which was quite a sight. I saw Ed at the last show I did at the RSC. He came to see Twelfth Night and we had a night out after.

#### Has there been a moment in the last twenty-five years when you've considered rekindling your career in music?

The funny thing is that I do introductions, and I always try to get music in if I can. For instance, I've done a production of Amadeus where I've played the piano live. I've also written a set of variations, and in Shakespeare's shows, if there's an opportunity to pull out an accordion or play a guitar, then I always try and get that in.

#### And if you could have been in any band, who would you choose?

I suppose The Jam - you can't go wrong with them. I guess they were the only ones that I was really envious of, but I can't imagine that they had as much fun as we had in Tenpole Tudor. With Tenpole, it was all a bit more theatrical.

## Was there a particular production from your youth that inspired you to become an actor?

No. What happened was that I was having a difficult time with my stepfather. We didn't see eye-to-eye. Things reached a head when I was sixteen, and I ran away from home. I don't know whether it's the same now, but in those days you had to be in the care of social workers until you were eighteen. So it was my social worker who asked what I enjoyed doing. I said that I used to act in the school play, so he suggested that I auditioned for a drama school. The only one that he'd ever heard of was RADA. So I wrote away to RADA, got an audition, and was very fortunate to get accepted. So I went there at the age of seventeen, and it completely changed the course of my life.

## Your acting repertoire includes numerous TV and theatre roles. Do you prefer stage or screen?

Well, they're completely different, that's the thing. I was always taught that when you're performing live, you're always playing to the furthest person in the back row of the gallery, whereas when you're doing television or film, quite the opposite is true you have to actually be doing, not showing, what you're thinking. In theatre, you have to show, to a certain extent, what your thought process is, whereas on screen you have to trust that the camera can see inside your head and see your thought process, which it can. It's the most extraordinary thing. So they're both completely different disciplines, but equally fascinating. I think it's hard to find an actor who's equally good in both mediums. I think you tend towards being better in one than the other, and I've always thought of myself as more of a stage actor. That said, I do enjoy film and TV, because you're using a completely different set of muscles, if you like.

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#### You've had a hugely successful career and been referred to as one of the finest actors of your generation. As such, what's the appeal for you of playing a role like Nyberg the pathologist in the recent BBC TV series of Wallander?

I don't know; it was really to do with Kenneth Branagh, because I've known Ken since RADA. In the first series, there was more to do. It seems that the whole focus of the thing has changed, and the direction in which they've gone with it seems to be much more about Wallander and what's in his head, rather than the group around him. So it's different, and it's kind of mutated a bit since the first series. To be honest, I've been really busy with theatre work, so I've not been able to get out there to do that much. I was doing Yes, Prime Minister all last year, and when this last Wallander series came up, they didn't want to let me go, so it became a rather comical situation where I'd fly out on a Tuesday morning, do my scene and fly straight back. I'd stand over a pit somewhere with a burnt-out corpse, with Ken next to me saying, "how long has he been dead?". I'd reply, "Oh, about two weeks", then I'd be back on the plane and performing in the theatre again that night. It was all quite crazy. So there was very little to do in this last series, but I couldn't have done anymore even if I'd wanted to.

#### So how has your criteria for accepting roles changed over the years?

It's just about it being interesting, really. I found playing Nyberg interesting because of the whole forensics thing. Initially, on the first series, we had a little bootcamp where I did things that I'd never done before, like firing a gun with real ammunition. It really makes you shake and your heart races. Then I'd go into a proper morgue and see how things really work. It was a fascinating learning process. So my criteria is based upon things that are different and challenging. That's what's so interesting about doing this Romeo And Juliet. I didn't get to do Romeo when I was a young actor, and here I am doing a complete re-imagining of it. This is such a beautiful piece, and I love stepping up to the challenge. I'm always interested in doing something that excites my imagination.

#### So is there a particular role that you'd still love to play?

There are certain classical ones and Shakespeare ones that I'd like to do. I'd like to do Richard III, and I'd also like to do Macbeth and Cyrano de Bergerac. As you get a bit older, you think, "what parts are open for me now, and what excites my imagination?".

#### Is there a particular actor with whom you'd like to work?

No, I can't say there is. I've worked with a lot of very talented people, and part of the surprise of the job - and the delight - is that you never know who you're going to be working with at any given point. In this particular play, I'm appearing with Kathryn Hunter, who is someone I remember from RADA. She was a couple of terms below me, and someone whom I've met through the years, but it's taken thirty-plus years for us to perform together. It was funny working with Simon Williams on Yes, Prime Minister, because I remember watching him in Upstairs Downstairs when I was a teenager. I remember thinking, "God, there he is!". It's one of the continual delights of the job.

#### Do you ever get starstruck?

No, I can't say I do. I know all the insecurities of being an actor, and I sort of know where they're coming from. I was in the same term as Mark Rylance at RADA. So when you're growing up through it with Mark, you kind of think, "well, who is there that's better than Mark, really?".

#### If you could instigate one rule in theatreland, what would it be?

I would make rehearsals later on in the day, because, as an actor, you only perform in the evening and on matinees, which are twice a week. But frequently when you're rehearsing, you do runs of plays in the morning - a time when your mindset is completely different to when you're performing at 8pm in the evening. And so I always find it odd, that period of adjustment where you spend four weeks or whatever during the day, then suddenly your clock completely changes, and you have to be at your best at a different time of the day. That's always been a strange thing for me. So yes, I'd make rehearsals later in the day.

What do you think is the key attribute in terms of ensuring longevity as an actor? Just being an actor, that's the longevity. The brilliant thing about actors - it's probably also something that's really annoying about them - is that they keep a childlike curiosity, and as long as you keep that, you stay young. I see actors in their eighties and they still have this passionate curiosity. It's all about trying to understand how people work. It's all about observation, and trying to relay that via a character - to tell people what they already know but haven't noticed. I guess that's what keeps you young. I've never really seen older actors turn into old people, because they all seem to retain that childlike delight. So if you want longevity, be an actor!

## Looking back on your career, is there anything that you would have done differently?

I would have been more aware of what I wanted to do. But you can't really plan an acting career - it doesn't work like that. I've had some sort of thought that I'd like to play this part or that part, and you get beyond a certain age and you think, "I'm too old for that now!". And there's a great sadness that

you've missed your chance with a certain part that you'd have liked to have played. So I guess I would have planned ahead a bit more.

#### So have you ever turned down an acting opportunity and later regretted it?


No, I don't think so. I've had plenty of parts that I've been up for and really wanted to do and not got, but that's different. So there's a lot of regret there, but generally I think I get a little instinct for something; parts come up and you think, "yeah, I should do that". Generally I have a good instinct, but the regret often comes when you really want to do something and it's between you and someone else, and it's the other person who gets it.

#### What would you say has been your proudest moment professionally?

Hell, that's a hard one. I've had a couple of real highs that I remember, one of which was Hamlet at Elsinore. When I came off after the first time performing there, I remember an extraordinary feeling as if I were walking on air - a feeling that I couldn't particularly put into words. Amadeus, which I did a couple of years ago, was also a high. It was only a short job, but I played Salieri - I've played Mozart twice - which is the real part, the best part and one that I understand very much. We did it with the late Sir Richard Hickox and the City of London Sinfonia, with a full chorus and soloists. So all the musical extracts from the play were performed live. We did it in places like The Barbican - big concert halls - and it was just absolutely thrilling to have the power of all that behind you. It's something that I remember very strongly.

Finally, what comes after A Tender Thing? I've had a busy time of it lately. I had a whole year of Yes, Prime Minister, then I went into doing Bingo alongside Patrick Stewart, quite a few television pieces, and then, of course, this - so at the moment I'm not planning anything. So yeah, a little bit of downtime at home - but not for too long I hope...

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
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


#### **Karine Polwart**

#### **Jefferson Starship**

The Robin, Bilston, Wed 17 October

Think Jefferson Starship and it's impossible not to think Jefferson Airplane, the betterknown Grace Slick-inspired 1960s band responsible for hippie-era counter-culture hits such as White Rabbit and Somebody To Love. Starship followed on in the early 1970s, as Airplane was in the process of disbanding, with singer-guitarist Paul Kantner's concept album Blows Against The Empire providing the group with an impressive kick-start. The band has undergone numerous changes of personnel in the ensuing decades, and for a period even forsook its original mix of psychedelic and electric folk music in favour of more pop-driven tunes, before reverting to the sound that had made its name.

#### Tall Ships

The Rainbow, Birmingham, Sun 14 October Featuring at the top of the bill on the BBC Introducing stage at this year's Reading and Leeds festivals, Tall Ships are on the brink of a major breakthrough. Their hard work promoting their upcoming album Everything Touching has seemingly paid off, with Zane Lowe recently playing new single Gallop on his show. Sounding like Morrissey but drawing comparisons with the likes of Minus The Bear, Sigur Rós and Biffy Clyro, the band are here supported by Dad Rocks! and Constant Waves.



#### **Fearless Vampire Killers**

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

#### **Marillion**

A packed Wolverhampton Civic waited in anticipation for Marillion to begin playing. When they did, they launched into a brand new song called Gaza - a seventeen-minute epic which perfectly highlighted both the band's musical genius and Rothery's virtuosity on guitar. The band went on to play a great mix of fan favourites both old and

new, with the featured songs from latest album Sounds That Can't Be Made proving that they can still create both fresh and challenging music. A chorus of the audience singing Sugar Mice while accompanied by the band brought a close to a fantastically enjoyable evening.

#### Roachford

The Jam House, Birmingham, 13 September

It's nearly a quarter of a century since Roachford's first major hit, but the band - headed up by namesake singer-songwriter Andrew Roachford - haven't lost any of their enthusiasm for performing live. After strutting around the stage in a style reminiscent of Mick Jagger, Andrew spent much of the remainder of the evening at the keyboard, enjoying plenty of banter with the audience between songs.

There were two things which became apparent during the performance. The first is that Andrew's rich, soulful voice is even better live than recorded - a real rarity in this day and age. The second is that the silky-voiced singer has the power to make grown men dance - an up-tempo rendition of This Generation had plenty of fellas engaging in an amusing-to-watch frenzy of movement.

Highlights included older songs such as The Way I Feel and Only To Be With You, 2007's Ride The Storm, and a couple of numbers from latest album Addictive: I Get High and Complicated.

The encore, which was perhaps a little too ballad-filled, was concluded with the inevitable '80s classic Cuddly Toy, an appropriately upbeat way to round off an entertaining evening.

# **Forests**

Old Rep, Birmingham

The star of this production is the leafless potted plant tree that holds centre-stage. The white box set is intriguing. Those who saw Calixto Bieito's Hamlet for Birmingham Rep expect to be astounded - and we are. Various passages from many of Shakespeare's plays have been put together to form one script. There's a mix of English and Catalan - Catalunya is an area with a history of translating Shakespeare. This script is subtitled, and for the first fifty minutes of the production, my mind was trying to remember which play each extract came from.

After a slow opening, the action becomes dirty. Literally dirty, courtesy of a serious amount of top soil from around the roots of the tree. The uncompromising and abusive nature of this interpretation of wonderful language shifts a gear. When Katy Stephen steals Titania's words from A Midsummer's Night's Dream, I longed for the original play. And this is the problem with Forests; there's no strong narrative driving the drama on. Instead of a coherent story, we have bite-sized morsels of fiction - and the potential of a talented cast failing to be fully realised.

Unfortunately, this is not innovative theatre. Jan Watts



# **Legally Blonde**

Alexandra Theatre, Birmingham

Okay, so I must have been the only person on the planet not to have seen Legally Blonde the movie, but on our way to the Alexandra Theatre, I was assured by my companion that the stage version would be 'a hoot and a giggle'.

On arrival, the opening-night atmosphere was really buzzing, so I was certainly looking forward to having a good time - and disappoint it did not.

The musical starts off in a sorority house with a big song-and-dance number, and the fun just spirals from there. Each song was bolder than the last, with some exceptional dance sequences in the prison and courtroom scenes. These top numbers were perfectly punctuated by some wonderful performances from the actors, and I was particularly surprised by how well Gareth Gates came across as the arrogant yet smooth Warner.

All in all, a great night out with the girlies. And do take note, ladies - this is most definitely a show to attend with your best pals rather than your boyfriend or hubby. There were plenty of draggedalong husbands in evidence on the night, desperately clinging to the final shreds of their masculinity as this all-singing, all-dancing pink masquerade was paraded in front of them. # **Fragile**

Belgrade Theatre, Coventry

Containing strong language and themes of an adult nature, Fragile comprises a series of monologues charting one man's dramatic journey through the horrors of traumatic abuse to a place of self-discovery and ultimate redemption. The play is the work of BAFTA Award-winning Coventry writer Geoff Thompson, and makes for a disturbing, disquieting and altogether challenging evening of theatre. Indeed, its intensity is such that you're left somewhat relieved that its running time barely touches seventy-five minutes. By curtain-down, you're ready for a release from the experience of watching the play's one and only character reliving the appalling event that so emotionally scarred him at the hugely vulnerable age of eleven.

That said, while you've had enough of the trauma, it's hard to leave behind you the experience of watching Craig Conway's immensely engaging performance. Seventyfive minutes in the company of this talented actor really isn't enough.

Playwright Thompson should be proud of this work - Fragile is a profoundly affecting piece of theatre, presented in an era when so many theatre productions have so relatively little to say. Sally Compton ■■■■■

## Fine French flair...

## REVIEW

Although I'd been to Edmunds before, this was my first visit since Chef Didier Philipot joined the team to head up the kitchen.

Chef Didier is well known in the city, and aims to inject some of his passion for French cuisine into new dishes on the Edmunds menu. He describes his cooking as "classical and seasonal, with a modern twist", and places a particular emphasis on the quality of the produce he uses. Situated in Brindleyplace, Edmunds was busy on the Friday night we paid a visit. The restaurant is a small but beautifully proportioned room, decorated in warm golden tones, with lighting provided by three sets of stainless steel drop lamps. Large square cut windows are draped in gorgeous golden taupe and black drapes. It gives the dining area, which accommodates around forty covers, a warm and

cosy atmosphere. The whole ambiance is elegant and relaxed.

After a quick look at the a la carte menu, we enjoyed a glass of Champagne; a beautifully light bubbly from the charming sommelier Nuno Martins.

For my starter, I chose the scallops with a smoked haddock and potato brandade, with new season green asparagus, which was great. My husband had a fabulous starter of Devon crab - a Brixham crab risotto, fricassee of seasonal wild mushroom, tarragon, lobster and brandy veloute. Pretty on a plate and perfect on the palate.

For mains, I stayed away from my usual choice of lamb and went for the wild sea bass. And I was certainly 'wild' about it - a beautiful piece of fish, served with tomato, red peppers, asparagus and artichoke, with a well-matched basil, saffron and lemon dressing.

Hubby had a medley of lamb - cutlet, sweetbreads,

and a confit shoulder bonbon - which came with a goats cheese dauphine. Some of the lamb was a tad undercooked, but on the whole was very tasty. For dessert, the strawberry option came highly recommended. Although it looked lovely on the plate and tasted pleasant enough, the strawberry gariguette, strawberry macaroon with champagne jelly, wasn't quite as delightful an experience as I was expecting. At £44.50 for three courses, Edmunds is a bit on the pricey side - but good things should never be cheap. Anita Champaneri

## Brazilian steak house turns a meal into a feast

Ceremoniously opened in the presence of scantily clad samba girls, Rodizio Rico is an entirely new concept to Birmingham. The Churrascaria, or Brazilian steak house, is the first Rodizio Rico to be opened outside London, and its chic canalside location at The Cube offers one of the best views in town. The spacious, stylish interior is modern, with exposed wood offering a nod to authenticity. The pièce de résistance, however, is the stunning floor-to-ceiling wine display, which divides the bar and restaurant. Settling into the best seats in the house, our windowside view was deliciously cosmopolitan. Here, we were introduced to a whole new way of eating - one which involves the non-stop provision of freshly cooked meat and the use of a red/green card to alert your passador (meat carver) that you're either ready for more or taking a breather.

With a selection of fourteen cuts of meat served straight from the grill, beef, pork, lamb and chicken on the menu, and a hearty salad bar with up to ten hot and ten cold Brazilian street food dishes, lettuce lovers need not apply.

Succulent, fresh and well seasoned, the chicken leg, fillet steak, lamb leg and beef rib stood out in particular, whilst the hot rice and refried beans from the salad bar helped to balance out the protein. For a set price of £23.50, the menu is a carnivore's delight, and is best appreciated on a growling stomach. Great value if you can take the heat, a visit to Rodizio Rico turns a meal into a feast. 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
